

The Commissioners' Court in and for Sabine County, Texas, met in special session, Monday, October 28th, 1929, which all members, presents, to-wit: R. H. Dent, County Judge, E. J. McGown, Comm'r. Prec. No. 1, J. D. Edgar, Comm'r. Prec. No. 2, J. D. Edgar, Comm'r. Prec. No. 3, J. E. Minton, Comm'r. Prec. No. 4, Mrs. Berta Harper, County Clerk, and E. B. Smith, Sheriff, and transacted the following business, to-wit:

Ordered by the court, that Accounts be allowed, as per account ledger.

That the following persons be allowed amounts as set out below, for care of paupers, and burial of a pauper. To Mrs. Docia Rodgers, \$35.00, for Board and care of Reb. Meadow, for one month, beginning about the 20th, inst., _____ To John Anderson, \$10.00, for care of Miss Garlington, a pauper. To Jim Reed, \$22.00, for Medical Attention, to One Demon, a Transient pauper. To John Bolton, \$31.00, for burial of Negro Woman, pauper. All the above amounts to be paid out of the General County Fund.

It is also ordered by the court that Mack Garlington, be allowed \$2.00, each for two wolf scalps, which were presented by him, to the Court and accepted as evidence of proof of his killing two wolves, in the County. It is, therefore, ordered, by the court that the County Clerk, issue to him, the said Mack Garlington, script against the General County fund in the amount of \$4.00, in compliance to Article 192, Revised Civil Statutes.

It is further ordered by the court that the road beginning, within about 150 yards, east of what has formerly been known as the Tom Bell, bridge, on Patroon creek, and ending at the Shelby County line, near Palmers place, by way of Perkins, Harveys and June Smiths places, be designated, and established as a public road, of the 2nd class, a distance of approximately 3 1/2 miles.

It is also ordered by the court that the portion of road leading from Ide Russells place to the Shelby County line, known as the Time and East Hamilton road be discontinued, as a public road.

No further business, court adjourned, till the 12th day of November, 1929.
