The Commissioners ourt in and for Sabine County, Texas; met in special session, Monday October 28th, 1929, which all members, presents, to wit: R. H. Dent; County Judge, E. J. McGown, Comm'r. Frect. No. 1, J. D. Edgar, Comm'r Prect. No. 2, J. D. Edgar, Comm'r Prect. No. 3, V. E. Minton, Comm'r Prect. No. 4, Mrs. Berta Harper, County, Clerk, and E. B. Smith, Sheriff, and transacted the following business, to wit

Ordered by the court, that Accounts be allowed, as per account ledger;

That the following persons be allowed amounts as set out below, for care of paupers, and buriat of a pauper. To Mrs. Docia Rodgers, \$35.00, for Board and care of Reb. "eadow, for one month, beginning about the 20th, inst., . To John Anderson, \$10.00 for care of Miss Garlington, a pauper. To Jim Reed, \$22.00, for Medical Attention, to One Demon, a Transfert, pauper. To John Bolton, \$31,00, for burial of Negro Woman, pauper. All the above amounts to be paid out of the General County Fund.

It is also ordered by the court that "ack Garlington, be allowed \$2.00, each for two wolf scalps, which were presented by him, to the Court and accepted as evidence of proof of his killing two wolfes, in the County. It is, therefore, ordered, by the court that the County Clerk, issue to him, the said mack Carlin ton, script against the General County fund in the amount of \$4.00, in compliance to Article 192, gevised Civil Statutes.

It is further ordered by the court that the road baginning, within about 150 yards, east of what has formerly keen known as the Tom Bell, bridge, on a troom creek, and ending at the Shelby County line, near Palmers place, by way of ferkins, Harveys and June Smiths places, bedesignated, and established as a public road, of the 2nd class, a distance of approximately 1四年44年1月1日日本 3g miles.

It is also ordered by the court that the portion of road leading from lac Russells place to the Shelby County line, known as the Time and East Bamilton road be discontinued, as a public road.

No further basiness, court adjourned, till the 12th day of November, 1929. R. H. Dent, County Judge.
