

The Commissioner's Court of Sabine County, Texas, met in regular session, Monday, December 9, 1929; all members present to-wit: R. H. Dent, County Judge, E. J. McCown, Commissioner Precinct No. 1, J. A. Huden, Commissioner Precinct No. 2, J. D. Edgar, Commissioner Precinct No. 3, J. E. Minton, Commissioner Precinct No. 4, ^{Ma.} Berta Harper, County Clerk, and E. B. Smith, sheriff, and transacted the following business;

Bills for the past month were allowed. The monthly report of the County Treasurer was approved. A motion by J. D. Edgar, second by J. A. Huden, was that forty five Dollars, be allowed to the Local Red Cross for the care and aid of several dependants in town. Motion carried. Warrant to be issued payable to A. M. Jones, mayor, out of the General County Fund and disbursed according to the discretion of the local Red Cross.

It is ordered by the Court that The First National Bank, County Depository, be allowed to carry the amount of Jury Script now outstanding and unpaid, in the amount of approximately Two Hundred (\$200.) dollars, and that they be allowed five per cent (5%) of the amount of Script so carried, until same is taken up by the County Treasurer.

The Court would now serve notice on all those who use portions of the Court House as a rendezvous for Domino playing, that from and after the time when repairs shall have begun and ended no more of this practice can be allowed as we propose to make this look like a County Capitol, should and hereafter to require all persons to respect it as such.

There being no further business at this time court adjourned until the 20th day of December, 1929.
