

The Commissioners' Court of Sabine County, Texas, met in regular session, Nov. 10th, 1930, in the regular meeting place thereof, in the court house, with all members present, to-wit: R. H. Dent, County Judge; E. J. McEown, Commr. # 1; J. A. Hyden, Commr. # 2; J. D. Edgar, Commr. # 3, J. E. Minton, Commr. #4; E. B. Smith, Sheriff, and Mrs. Berta Harper, County Clerk, at which time the following business was transacted.

It is ordered by the court that warrant No. 557, issued to Stafford Lowdon Company, of Fort Worth, Texas, be cancelled upon said companies repeated declaration that said warrant is lost, and that duplicate thereof, be issued to them, out of Gen County Fund.

It is ordered by the court that Tax Collector, J. J. Cammack, be authorized to accept taxes for 1930, on basis of \$5.00 per acre valuation, on 139 acres, of J. H. Bennifield, on account of error in assessment.

On this day came on to be considered the returns of the General Election held on Tuesday Nov. 10, 1930, in Sabine County, and it appearing that said election was in all respects legally held and that said returns were duly and legally made and that there were cast at said election at voting precincts No. 1- 17, inclusive, for each state, district, County, and Precinct candidate the following number of votes to-wit:

For State and County Nominees the maximum number of votes cast were 756, precinct Nominees in proportion.

It appearing to the court from said returns the following candidates for State, District, County and Precinct officers were elected by receiving the majority of said votes voted at said election and the court does hereby declare the following named candidates elected to-wit:

The following resolution was passed (resolution copied below), also a contract was entered into with J. R. Phillips Investment Company for refunding all outstanding P. I. and Road and Bridge Script. No further business at this time court adjourned.

Whereas: The holders of General County Script and especially those officers whose salary on such script are seriously handicapped by discount and non-payment and

Whereas: the County depository on account of having numerous other script has been unwilling to carry General County script further.

Therefore, be it ordered by the Commissioners' court that all Permanent Improvement, and All Road and Bridge Script outstanding be refunded into interest bearing warrant so that the County Depository will have no occasion to carry any script to any considerable amount other than General County script and it is further ordered by the Court that the General County fund be supplemented and aided out of the Permanent Improvement fund as the taxes for the incoming year is received and that the First National Bank, County Depository, upon this representation be earnestly requested to carry outstanding General County Script for which they will be allowed 4% interest for the time said script is so carried and that said script by the aid of transfers and by its own income will be redeemed at the close of collection at the end of the tax collecting period or when the January report of the Tax Collector's office in the year 1931 is received.
