

ORDER DECLARING RESULT OF ELECTION )  
FOR THE ABOLITION OF THE CORPORATE )  
EXISTENCE OF THE CITY OF HEMPHILL: )

This the 17th day of November, A. D. 1930, came on to be tabulated and counted before and by me, the County Judge, of Sabine County, Texas, the returns of a certain Election heretofore ordered by me to be held on the 15th day of November, A. D. 1930, to enable the property tax-paying citizens who are residents of the hereinafter described incorporated limits of the City of Hemphill, Texas, to determine whether or not the qualified voters of said City shall abolish its corporate existence, said territory being described by metes and bounds as follows: Beginning at a point on the E. bank of Cooper branch, at the S. W. corner of a 36-8/10 acre survey owned by Mrs. M. Knox, thence in a northerly direction with the meanders to the said Cooper branch to where said branch crosses the street leading from Hemphill to East Layfield at the N. W. corner of the P. M. Coussons tract. Thence East with the south margin of right-of-way of said street from Hemphill to E. Layfield to where same intersects the W. E. line of the town of Hemphill. Thence north with the W. E. line of the town of Hemphill to the east southerly corner of the A. D. Hamilton tract in said W. E. line of said town of Hemphill. Thence N. 60° W. along said Hamilton's line 140 yds. to corner in East Margin of

the Hemphill-Bronson highway. Thence N. 53 E. to corner 25 vrs. Thence N. 6 $\frac{1}{2}$  W. along Hamilton's W. E. line 240 vrs. to corner in the S. B. line of the E. W. Clark 11-1/5 acres. Thence in an easterly direction along said E. W. Clark, S. B. line to his S. E. corner. Thence North-erly with the E. B. line of said E. W. Clark tract to his N. E. corner, same being the N. W. corner of the A. D. Hamilton land. Thence N. 71 E. 407 vrs. with the N. B. line of said Hamilton tract to the N. E. corner of the said Hamilton tract. Thence N. 134 $\frac{1}{2}$  vrs. to the corner, the same being the S. E. corner of the Hamilton & Minton 4 acre tract. Thence S. 74 $\frac{1}{2}$  W. 229 vrs. to S. W. corner of said Hamilton & Minton 4 acre tract. Thence N. 115 vrs. to the N. W. corner of said 4 acre tract. Thence in a N. E. direction with the N. B. line of said 4 acre tract to the point where said line intersects the S. B. line of the right of way of the L. H. & G. Ry. Co. Thence N. to the S. W. corner of a two acre block known as the G. W. Speights 2 acre tract. Thence N. 74 E. with the S. B. line of said 2 acre tract pass its S. E. corner at 122 vrs. stake for corner in W. B. line of the G. W. Alford 7 acre tract. Thence N. with Alford's W. B. line to his N. W. corner. Thence N. 76 E. 1074 vrs. to S. W. corner of the J. O. Toole 53-3/4 acre survey, continue same course along Toole's S. B. line to a point in said line where the east edge of the Hemphill Milam highway crosses said line. Thence with the East margin of right-of-way of said Hemphill Milam highway to its intersection of said road with the highway leading from Hemphill, to Sabinetown. Thence South with the sub-division out of said Joseph Walker survey owned by Mrs. L. M. Knox; to the S. B. line of said Joseph Walker survey. Thence West with the South boundary line of said Joseph Walker survey to a point where said line intersects the N. B. line of the John Haley survey. Thence in a N. W. direction with the N. B. line of the said Haley survey to its N. W. corner. Thence continuing the same course along S. B. line of said 36-8/10 acre tract owned by Mrs. L. M. Knox, to the place of beginning.

And It appearing to me upon so tabulating and counting such returns that 114 votes were cast in favor of the abolition of the corporate existence and 80 votes were cast against the abolition of corporate existence of said City, and that such election carried in favor of such proposition by a majority of 34 votes, it is accordingly ordered that such election resulted, and it is hereby declared to be in favor of the abolition of the corporate existence of the City of Hemphill, described by the metes and bounds set out above, and that from this date, such corporation shall cease to exist. It is further ordered that this order be entered of record in the minutes of the Commissioner's court of Sabine County, Texas.
