
The Commissioners' Court met in regular session December 8th, 1930, all members present, to wit: R. H. Dent, County Judge; D. J. McCown, Commissioner Precinct No. 1; J. A. Hyden, Commissioner Precinct No. 2; J. D. Edgar, Commissioner Precinct No. 3; J. E. Minton, Commissioner Precinct No. 4; Mrs. Berta Harrel, County Clerk, and E. B. Smith, Sheriff, and transacted the following business:

It is ordered by the court that \$2.00 per day be the maximum wage hereafter allowed for ordinary road labor and \$4.00 per day for team and driver. Also that drivers and operators of tractors and graders be required to operate from 7 A. M. till 5 P. M., allowing one hour for lunch, or not less than nine hours labor a day.

The above orders passed by motion and second duly had and carried, also on motion of J. D. Edgar seconded by J. A. Hyden motion carried. The motion being, "That the court do not act finally on a petition for franchises which petition was presented by R. H. Smith, for the Texas Louisiana Power and Light Company."

It is further ordered by the court that the janitor be required to clean the jail more thoroughly including the most neat arrangement of election boxes and other containers necessary to be kept and the removing and having hauled away trash and worthless material. Said removal of accumulated trash should be made every two months or oftener, if necessary. As much as \$6.00 a year as expense of hauling this trash will be allowed by the county, provided that persons so hauling must be instructed to place said rubbish well away from any public road or any public place. In compliance with the law relating to public roads, etc., the Janitor is also required to clean windows of all dirt and cobwebs, keep paper, cans, bottlers etc., off the yard. Also clean leaves and trash from around the hedge, stack weed and do not allow the yard to remain littered with trash, paper or anything of that kind for any length of time longer than absolutely necessary by reason of his having time, etc.

It is ordered by the court that Trude Chance be authorized to make a list from the Clerk's records of all mineral leases in effect on January 31, 1930, all mineral rights in force, and all vendor's lien notes for the purpose of furnishing to the tax assessor with the requirement that he assess these for taxation for the year 1931. And it is stipulated and agreed that she be paid \$3.00 a day for such services, the work to last approximately three weeks.

No further business at this time the court adjourned.
