

The Honorable Commissioners' court in and for Sabine County, met in special Session, January 25th, 1932, with the following members present, to-wit: R.H. Dent, County Judge, E. J. McGowen, Commr. Prec. No. 1, W. R. Low, Commr. Prec. 3, J. E. Minton, Commr. Prec. No. 4, Mrs. Berta Harper, Clerk and E. B. Smith, sheriff, and transacted the following business, to-wit:

Script in payment of bills by commissioners was allowed.

A petition by O. P. Williams, and 40 others was presented to the court which petition requested the rebuilding of a bridge at the Bell Crossing of Mill creek. It was decided to comply with the request expressed in the petition.

The following order was passed: It is ordered by the court that 92 acres of the J. S. Lacy survey which appears on the rolls, at a value of \$800.00 be reduced to \$460.00 on account of error in the assessment. The land in question being in the \$5.00 per acre classification. The tax collector is therefore authorized and directed to receive tax settlement for the year 1931 on a valuation of \$460.00. Said property assessed in the name of T.B. Hamilton, et al;

No further business coming up at this time, court adjourned.
