Minton, Commissioner, Precinct No. 4, and the following proceedings among others, were had to-wit:

Whereas, at the March term of this court which was held on the 14th day of March, a regular session of this court, and whereas, there was passed at said March term, of this court, the following order among others to-wit:

Whereas, the members of this court had prior to the said March term of court legally advertised for bids on metal culverts for the use of Sabine County, Texas, as prescribed by the Statutes governing the purchase of supplies, and whereas, the said court after canvassing the bids, found that in their judgment the bid of Wyatt Metal & Boiler Works of Dallas Texas, were the low bidders, and it was therefore ordered adjudged, and decreed by the court at said March term of this court, that Wyatt Metal & Boiler Works of Dallas Texas, be and in all things awarded said contract, and it was so ordered.

It now appears that the clerk of this court in some way failed to get or enter said order upon the minutes of this court, and it is therefore ordered, adjudged and decreed by this court now in session, that said order of the March term be in things ratified, and that this order entered sundry sundry, and made effective as of date March 14th, 1932, and it is so ordered.
