The Tax Collector is authorized to charge the acreage of Dave Hall 52 acres on the J.E. Ellison, survey and calculate the taxes on 45 acres on the same survey for the reason that Mr. Hall owns only 45 acres and that the 52 acres represents an error in assessment.

The Tax Collector is authorized to figure the tax of H.L. Jordan, on a basis of 56 acres the court agreeing that 3 1/2 acres may be deducted on account of having been deeded to the State of Texas for right-of-way. And that hereafter the 59 1/2 acres may be assessed and collected on a basis of 56 acres.

It is further ordered that a compromise agreement in regard to right-of-way conveyed by H. L. Jordan, be incorporated in the minutes of this session which reads as follows:

The State of Texas)
 County of Sabine) In consideration of H. L. Jordan, and wife, May Jordan, executing a right-of-way Deed to The State of Texas, covering a width of 50 feet on the South side of the center line of highway No. 933, as now surveyed by the resident engineer, and located on the John Clark survey, where they now reside, and the further consideration of the co-operation of said Jordan, and wife in donating said right-of-way for the improvement at one of highway No. 933, from Memphis to Bronson, Texas, Sabine County, acting by and through its duly authorized agents, the Commissioner's court of Said County agrees to furnish a corrugated iron culvert of sufficient size to take care of the drainage and provide a road connecting with said highway for the benefit of the said H. L. Jordan, and the said Court agrees to take care of the expense of installing this culvert and to keep in repair the road connection with this highway as long as the road shall be used by the said H. L. Jordan.
