Prect. No. 3. J.E.Minton, Com. Prect. No. 4, and the following proceedings among other were had, to-wit:

CLAIM OF WYATT METAL & BOILER WORKS,  
Dallas, Texas.

On this day came on to be heard the claim of the said Wyatt Metal & Boiler Works, of Dallas, and it appearing to the court that the County of Sabine, was indebted to the above firm, in the amount of Nine Thousand Two Hundred Sixteen Dollars and sixty six cents, and whereas the said bills were contracted for by the members of this court with the understanding that if the bills were not paid by August, 1932, that said claims would bear interest at the rate of Six Per cent. It is therefore ordered adjudged and decreed by this court that the claim as above mentioned be and is in all things approved and allowed. and the Clerk of this court is hereby authorized and directed to issue to said Wyatt Metal & Boiler Works, warrant in the above amount, and to incorporate into said warrant that it shall bear Six Per cent interest from August, 1st, 1932, until paid, and it is further ordered that the County Treasurer, is hereby directed to register same on the records of his office, in accordance with the issuance as indicated by the County Clerk.

The Tax Collector is authorized and directed to calculate the taxes on 340 acres of the Henry Canfield, League, at \$5.00 per acre, belonging to Jas. G. Barker, which for the years 1929-1932 inclusive, has been on the unnumbered roll and to accept payment from Jas. G. Barker at this figure and to charge off all in excess of \$5.00 per acre on said tract, as error in assessment.

Whereas, it has been made known to the court that the homestead of Jas. G. Barker, in the town of Hemphill, Sabine County, Texas, in the Joseph Walker survey of land, abstract No. 57, is delinquent for taxes due thereon for the years A. D. 1928, 1929, 1930 and 1931.

And whereas, there are lien holders against said homestead that would be difficult to reach with service of legal process, if a suit for said taxes was contested.

And, whereas, the said Jas. G. Barker, desires to adjust and settle said delinquent taxes for the years named above, and if settled, will pay the taxes thereon, for the year A. D. 1932, if an adjustment can be reached as to the delinquent taxes for the years named herein.

And, whereas, there seems to have been errors made in the way of amount of personal property of the said Jas. G. Barker, shown upon the tax rolls of the County for the years named herein, it having been called to the attention of the court that for the year A. D. 1929, the said Jas. G. Barker, shows to have been charged upon the rolls for that said year with the personal property in the amount of \$1700.00, when the homestead itself was valued at \$1500.00, the said Jas. G. Barker, claiming to have had very little personal property for said years;

It is therefore, ordered, by the court that the County attorney of Sabine County, Texas, be, and he is hereby authorized to settle with the said Jas. G. Barker, the owner of the above described land, the taxes thereon, for the years A. D. 1928; 1929; 1930 and 1931, for the sum of \$153.19;

It is ordered by the court that the Tax Collector collect from Mrs. T. Dickerson, on real estate only on Years, 1930-1931. That personal property for such years be charged off as error in assessment.

It is ordered by the court that General Fund Funding Warrant # 1, be purchased from funds of Road Districts Nos. One and Six. Also that Bonds of District No. 12, Nos. 11 and 17 be purchased from same fund at the price of 98¢ and interest \$500.00 each also that \$720.00 be paid J. H. Phillips Investment Co., as refunding fees. It is further ordered that \$489.00 be transferred from the road and Bridge fund to the Road and Bridge Special fund.

There being no further business, court is adjourned.
