

The Commissioners' court in and for Sabine County, met in Regular Session, March 27th, 1933, with the following members present, to-wit: Edward Harper, County Judge, H.E. White, and Commr. Prec. No. 1, P.H. McGown, Commr. 3, E. G. Smith, Commr. Prec. # 2, R.W. Chapman, Commr. Prec. 4, Zeda Davidson County Clerk, and Geo. W. Russell, Sheriff, and transacted the following business.

On Motion of H.E. White, second by R.W. Chapman, vote unanimous, it is ordered by the court that the county Judge be paid \$3.00 per day for presiding over the Commissioners court.

On Motion by P.H. McGown, second by H.E. White, vote unanimous, it is ordered by the court that W.N. Garriott, Constable of Precinct No. 6, be, and he is hereby authorized to appoint Bob Harris, as Deputy Constable of Precinct # 6, of Sabine County, Texas.

THE FOLLOWING bid was presented to the Commissioners' court as County Depository of Sabine County, Texas.

To the Honorable Commissioners Court, Sabine County, Hemphill, Texas.

Gentlemen:

Persuant to your request we hereby submit you the following bid to act as your county Depository beginning this date, March 29th, 1933, and ending the second Monday in February 1935.

We will pay you two per cent (2%) interest on your daily balances, and do other duties imposed upon us as your Depository under the laws of Texas.

The above bid however is made contingent upon a contract previously had by the Commissioners court with the First National Bank in Hemphill, where there is a controversy regarding approximately \$10,000.00 in scrip or warrants held by the First National Bank in Hemphill and if you award us your Depository we will require that you leave a balance of \$10,000.00 of your funds with this bank until such time the controversy with the First National Bank in Hemphill is settled or adjusted; however this proposal in no manner waives any rights of the First National Bank of San Augustine existing under the contract between said bank and the First National Bank in Hemphill, under date of March 20th, 1933.

Whereas, it is necessary for Sabine County to select a depository for the next two years;  
And whereas the First National Bank in San Augustine is the nearest bank to the County  
and is the present depository and is willing to continue to act for the ensuing two years as the  
County depository and pay to the County two (2%) per cent, interest on daily balances.

On Motion by H. E. White, second by R. W. Chapman, it is therefore ordered that the First  
National Bank in San Augustine, be and is hereby selected and designated as the Depository for  
Sabine County, for the ensuing two years upon the filing of the depository bond.

It is further ordered that the County treasurer be and he is hereby instructed during said  
two years to retain as much as Ten thousand (\$10,000.00) dollars at all times on deposit in said  
Depository.

It is further ordered that Sabine County shall pay seven (7%) per cent, on warrants carried  
by the bank for the purpose of paying the salaries of county officers' for the current year  
should any money be advanced for said purposes.

It is contemplated that said depository should not be required during any current year to  
carry more of the County script against any fund than is covered by current expenses of said  
year and that will be paid by the taxes levied for said year.

In the selection of said Depository it is further agreed that at the end of the period of  
two years and shall at any time before such period should said bank cease to be the County  
Depository and any other depository selected that the county will thereupon pay off in full the  
County legal script carried by the bank.

No further business, court is adjourned.
