

The Commissioners' court of Sabine County, met in Regular Session July 10th, 1933, with all members present to-wit: Edw. Harper, County Judge, H.E. White, Commr. Precinct No. 1, E.C. Smith, Commr. Precinct No. 2, P.H. McGown, Commr. Precinct No. 3, R.W. Chapman, Commr. Precinct No. 4, Geo. W. Russell, Sheriff, and Zeda Davidson, County Clerk, and transacted business as follows:

On motion by P.H. McGown, second by E. C. Smith, vote unanimous, it is ordered by the court that Jim Wilson, be, and he is hereby appointed Deputy Constable of Precinct No. 6, of Sabine County, Texas.

On motion duly had and carried, it is ordered by the court that Scrip # 312, issued to Sabine Citizens Telephone Co. be cancelled, and scrip in lieu thereof be issued to R.M. Pinkston, out of the same fund and in the same amounts, and in two pieces of scrip to-wit: one for \$40.50 and one for \$23.80.

On motion duly had and carried, it is ordered by the court that Monthly reports of Edward Harper, and W.M. Honeycutt, be and they are hereby in all things approved.

On motion duly had and carried, it is ordered by the court that scrip No. 37 and 332, is -

sued to Toole Mercantile Company, and A. J. Howard, receiver, out of the P.I. Fund, be cancelled and script in lieu thereof, be issued, for the same amounts, to Toole Merc. Co., out of the P. I.; Cur. Expense Fund.

On motion duly had and carried, it is ordered by the court that the resignation of D. E. Cooper as Justice of the Peace of Precinct No. 3, of Sabine County, be accepted, and A. Hambrick be appointed in his place. It is further ordered by the court that the bond of the same A. Hambrick be and is hereby approved.

On motion by H.E. White, second by P.H. McGown, vote unanimous, it is ordered by the court that the Quarterly report of the County Treasure be, and the same is hereby in all things approved.

Whereas, it has been made known to the court and petition having been presented to the court and request the appointment of Justice of the Peace for Precinct No. 4, in Sabine County Texas, G. C. Wood is duly qualified and acting as Justice of the Peace No. 4, of Sabine County Texas, having moved from the county and has not resided therein for a period of more than ninety days during which time he has not exercised his duties as such and his whereabouts being unknown to the court, which fact prevented the five days notice required to be given in such cases, and a petition signed by J. J. Williams and thirteen others asking that E. G. Hart be appointed Justice of the Peace in said precinct. The same was taken under consideration and upon motion duly seconded it was ordered that the office be declared vacant and E. G. Hart appointed to fill said vacancy.

On motion by P.H. McGown, seconded by E.C. Smith, it is ordered by the court that all County convicts, which have fines outstanding against them unpaid, that have accrued in the courts of the County, be worked upon the public roads, until the fines are discharged by course of law; and that the Sheriff of Sabine County Texas, have the custody of said convicts, and that he be paid the sum of \$1.50 per day for the Guarding of said convicts, while they are being worked upon the roads of the County. Eugene Davidson is hereby appointed as guard at \$1.50 per day.

On motion duly had and carried, it is ordered by the court that the following petition be, and the same is hereby granted, and the County Judge is hereby authorized to order an election for said purposes, as follows, to-wit:

We, the undersigned qualified property and paying voters of Rosevine Consolidated Common School District No. 17, in Sabine County, pray that an election be ordered to be held in said district to determine whether a majority of the legally qualified property and paying voters of said district desire to assume and pay off the outstanding bonded indebtedness of the Rosevine Consolidated Common School District of this County as follows:

Rosevine Con. Common School District No. 17, \$4400.00 Sabine County, Sand Hill No. 30, San Augustine, County \$2975.00, and to determine whether the commissioners' court of said County shall be authorized to levy, assess and collect annually while said bonds, or any of them, are outstanding a tax upon, all taxable property within said district sufficient to pay the current interest on said bonds and provide a sinking fund sufficient to pay the principal at maturity.

COUNTY JUDGE'S ORDER:

The State of Texas  
County of Sabine

Whereas, on the 10th day of July, 1933, a petition was presented to me for an election in Rosevine Consolidated Common School District No. 17, of this County on the question of determining whether a majority of the legally qualified property taxpaying voters of said district desire to assume and pay off the outstanding bonded indebtedness and authorizing a tax upon all taxable property within said district sufficient to pay the current interest on said bonds and to provide a sinking fund sufficient to pay the principal at maturity; and

It appearing that said petition bears the requisite number of signatures of qualified property taxpaying voters of said district and is in every respect in conformity with the law, and it further appearing that said Rosevine Consolidated Common School District No. 17, has been heretofore, on the 16th day of August, 1925, properly established in accordance with Art. 2806, R. S. 1925.

Now, therefore, I, Edward Harper, in my capacity as County Judge of Sabine County, Texas do hereby order that an election be held on the 12th day of August, 1933, at School House in said Rosevine Consolidated Common School District No. 17, of this County as established by order of the Commissioners' court of date the 6th day of April, 1921, which is recorded in Book M, pages 383, of the minutes of said court to determine whether a majority of the legally qualified property taxpaying voters of that district desire to assume and pay off the outstanding bonded indebtedness of the Rosevine Consolidated District No. 17, of \$4400.00 (Sabine County) and Sand Hill District No. 30, of \$2975.00 (San Augustine County) and to determine whether the Commissioners' court of this County shall be authorized to levy, assess and collect annually while said bonds or any of them are outstanding a tax upon all taxable property within said district sufficient to pay the current interest on said bonds and provide a sinking fund sufficient to pay the principal at maturity.

J.A. Baldree is hereby appointed presiding officer for said election and he shall select two judges and two clerks to assist him in holding the same and he shall within five days after said election has been held make due return thereof to the Commissioners' court of this County as is required by law for holding a general election.

All persons who are legally qualified voters of this State and of this County and who are resident property taxpayers in said district shall be entitled to vote at said election, and all voters desiring to support the proposition to assume the bonded indebtedness of said District.

shall have written or printed on their ballots the words;

"For the Assumption of the Bonds and the Tax"

and those opposed shall have written or printed on their ballots the words;

"Against the Assumption of the Bonds and the Tax"

The sheriff of this county shall give notice of said election by posting three notices in three public places in said district for three weeks before the election, and is further directed to have said notice of election published for three weeks prior to said election in some newspaper of general circulation that has been continuously and regularly published for more than one year previous to the date of this order in Sabine County, Texas, the date of first publication being not less than twenty-one full days prior to the date of election.
