The Commissioners' court in and for Sabine County, met in H gular Session, May 14th, 1934 with all members present, to-wit; Edw. Harper, County Judge, H. E. White, Commr. Prect. No. 1 E. C. Mith, Commr. Prect. No. 2, P. H. McCown, Commr. Prect. No. 3, R. W. Chapman, Commr. Frect No. 4, and Zeda Davidson, County Clerk, and transacted business, as follows, to-wit: Accounts were allowed as is shown by account ledger.

-On motion duly had and carried, it is ordered by the court that Scrip # 300, hade to B. McDonald, in the sum of \$3.30, out of the General Co. fund be, achielled and scrip in lieu thereof., be issued on the same fund, for the same purpose but in amount of \$2.08 and \$1.22. On motion duly had and carried it is ordered by the court that the Monthly E. F. McDona

It is ordered by the court that for E. Defee, H. Vestal, and G. L. Jordan, be allowed if 00 for holding said election, said \$1.00 to be paid out of the General County Fund. On motion made by R. H. McGown, seconded by P. W. Chapman; with a vote unanimous, in favor of said motion, it is ordered by the court that the resignation of M. L. Woodfin, as Justice of the Peace of Precintt No. 6, of Sabine County, be and same is hereby accepted, and the said M. L. Woodfin, is hereby discharged from further duthies thereof.

-On motion by McGown; second by E. C. Smith, it is ordered by the court and agreed that Sabine County, through the Commissioners' court, agrees and hereby barters and exchanges the County Ferry Boat, at Fendleton, to C. T. Whittlesey, for 3 culverts, 30 feet long, 20 in. in dia. and 1 culvert 14 ft. long, and 18 in. in dia. Said culverts to galvanized. It is agreed and understood that the County is to reserve the lumber off the top floor of the boat, additof said material to be delivered at the place where they are to be used. It is further agreed that in part consideration for said boat, the said C. T. Whittlesey is to return and have con celled Scrip No. 1020, in the amount of \$1.00 and scrip No. 1950, in the amount of \$24.00; by C. T. Whittlesey.

There being no further business, court adjourned, and later in the same day convened is a Board of Equalization, at which time they raised and lowered property valuations as they saw fit, and after being in session for five days adjourned, to meet back on the 18th day of June, 1934, to hear protest, if any, made by the property bwners of the County.

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
