The Commissioners! court in and for Sabine County, Teras, metrin Regular Session December 10th, 1934, with the following members presents to wit: "Haw, Harper County Judge, E. C. Smith Commr. Prect. No. 2, H. E. White, Commr. Frect. No. 1, P. H. McGown, County Prect. No. 3, and R. W. Chapman Commr. Frect. No. 4, Geo. W. "ussell, Sheriff, and Zeda Davidson, Clerk, and transacted business as follows, to-wit:

Accounts were allowed and approved as is shown by Minutes of Accounts allowed: On motion made by R. W. Chapman, seconded by P. H. AcCown, it is ordered by the court that the County Treasurer, be, and he is hereby authorized to place all money from the Current Tax Collections, that comes into the General County Fund, to the credit of the Ceneral Co. "B" Fund On motion made by R. W. Chapman, seconded by P. H. McCown, it is ordered by the court that A. G. Fratt be allowed the remainder of his fees for assessiong 1934 taxes.

On this the 10 day of December, 1934, by reason of benefits accruing to the County, and on motion by H. M. White, and seconded by E. C. Smith, it is ordered by the court, in regular session as sembled, that Sabine County will take ever and be responsible for the maintainance of all graded roads in Sabine County now constructed and (or) to be constructed by Civilian Conservation Corp Camps, except graded roads so constructed on State Forest Areas or within the 'exterior boundaries of the Federal National Forest Furchase Units, and that responsibility for the maintainance will be assumed upon the termination of Civilian Conservation Corps road construction work in the County by Camps administered by the Texas Forest Service.

The Commissioners Court of Subine County, Texas, at its regular session December 10th, 1934, passed the following order to-wit: That County Judge Edward Harper Be authorized and empowered to arrange budgets and execute contracts drawn by Extension service, A & M. College of Texas, and Sabine County providing for the employment of P. S. Coen as So. Agt. for Sabine County and to make such arrangements and stipulations as he deems necessary.

On this day came on to be canvaised the returns of an election held November 27th, 1934, to determine whether Högs, Sheep and Goats should be permitted to run at large, and it was found by the canvass of said returns that there were cast for "Permitting Hogs, Sheep and Goats to Run At Harge" 13 votes, and that there were cast Against "Permitting Hogs, Sheep and Goats to run at Large" 74 votes. It is therefore declared by the court that the Petition prohibiting hogs, sheep and goats to run at large, carried by a majority of 61 votes.

There being no further business, court is adjourned: County Judges
