The Commissioners' court met in Special Session June 25th, with all members present,  
to-wit: Edw. Harper, County Judge, T. R. Smith, Commr. Prect. No. 1, E. C. Smith, Commr.  
Prect. No. 2, P. H. McGown, Commr. Prect. No. 3, R. W. Chapman, Commr. Prect. No. 4, Geo. W.  
Russell, County Sheriff, and Zeda Davidson, County Clerk, and transacted business as follows:

COUNTY JUDGE'S ORDERS

The State of Texas )

County of Sabine )

Whereas, on the 14th day of May, 1936, a petition was presented to me for an election in Common School District Number 31 of this County on the question of issuing bonds for the purpose of building and equipping a combination auditorium and gymnasium and two class rooms, and authorizing a tax upon all taxable property within said district sufficient to pay current interest on said bonds and to provide a sinking fund sufficient to pay the principal at maturity; and

It appearing that said petition bears the requisite number of signatures of qualified property taxpaying voters of said district and is in every respect in conformity with the law; and

It further appearing that Sabine County contains a population of 11,998 according to the last United States census; and

It further appearing that said Common School District Number 31, has heretofore been properly established; and

It further appearing that said district as so established contains an area of 9-3/4 miles and that no other district has been reduced in area below nine square miles by reason of the creation of this district; and

And it further appearing that said district does not embrace any territory that was taken from any other school district that has been an outstanding issue of bonds at the date of such inclusion in this district;

Now, therefore, I, Edward Harper, County Judge of Sabine County, Texas, do hereby order that an election be held on Saturday, June 20, 1936, at the School House in Common School District Number 31, of this County to determine whether a majority of the legally qualified property taxpaying voters of that district desire the issuance of bonds on the faith and credit of said Common School in the amount of \$6000.00 the bonds to be of the denomination of \$100.00 each, numbered consecutively from 1 to 60, both inclusive, payable twenty (20) years, three bonds of \$100.00 to be paid annually until all are paid, and bearing 5 per cent interest per annum, for the purpose of building and equipping a combination auditorium and gymnasium and two class rooms and to determine whether the Commissioners court of this County shall be authorized to levy, assess and collect annually while said bonds or any of them, are outstanding a tax upon all taxable property within said district sufficient to pay the current interest on said bonds and provide a sinking fund sufficient to pay the principal at maturity.

Earnest King is hereby appointed presiding officer for said election and he shall select two judges and two clerks to assist him in holding the same, and he shall within five days after said election has been held make due return thereof to the Commissioners court of this court as is required by law for holding a general election.

All persons who are legally qualified voters of this State and of this county and who are resident property tax payers in said District shall be entitled to vote at said election, and all voters desiring to support the proposition to issue bonds shall have written or printed on their ballots the words;

"For the issuance of the bonds and the levying of the tax in payment thereof."

And those opposed shall have written or printed on their ballots the words;

"Against the issuance of the bonds and the levying of the tax in payment thereof."

The sheriff of this county shall give notice by posting three notices in three public places in said district for three weeks before the election.
