

The Commissioners' court in and for Sabine County, Texas, met in Regular Session, November 9th, 1936, with all members present, to-wit: Edw. Harper, County Judge, T. R. Smith, Commr. Prec't. No. 1, E. C. Smith, Commr. Prec't. No. 2, P. H. McEown, Commr. Prec't. No. 3, R. W. Chapman, Commr. Prec't. No. 4, Geo. W. Russell, Sheriff, and Zeda Davidson, County Clerk, and transacted business, as follows:

Accounts were allowed and approved as is shown by Minutes of Accounts allowed:

The Financial Report of the County, by Zeda Davidson County Clerk, was presented to the court, and by motion duly made seconded and passed, it is ordered by the court that the same be and is hereby approved.

On motion by T. R. Smith, seconded by R. W. Chapman, it is ordered by the court that the taxes on 41½ acres of land, situated on the William Clark survey in Sabine County, Texas, which was placed on the unrendered roll for the years, - - - - at the rate of \$10.00 per acre valuation, be placed on the rendered roll and valuation on said land be reduced to values to correspond with adjoining lands for each respective year. Said land being purchased by, and now owned by H. H. Boyett.

On motion by T. R. Smith, seconded by E. C. Smith, it is ordered by the court that the taxes on 27 acres of land, owned by Isaac Low heirs, on the Isaac Low survey Abst. # 35, which was placed on the Tax roll and assessed unknown, for the years 1920, 1929, 1931, 1933 at the rate of \$10.00 per acre valuation, and the year 1932 at the rate of \$12.00 per acre valuation, be placed on the rendered roll, and valued at the rate of \$5.00 per acre.

On motion duly had and seconded and passed, by the court, it is ordered that the quarterly report of Zeda Davidson, County Clerk, be and is hereby approved.

On Motion duly had, seconded and carried, it is ordered by the Court that the Quarterly Report of the County Treasurer, be and is hereby approved.

On motion duly had, seconded and carried, it is ordered by the court that the amount of \$748.00, be allowed as fees in Compiling Delinquent Tax Record from 1919 to date, to be paid from fees collected from said Delinquent Roll.

On motion duly had, seconded and carried, it is ordered by the court that Scrip # 883, issued to Earl Polke, in 1933, on the R & B Fund, in the sum of \$10.00, also Scrip # 880, issued to Earl Polke, in 1933, on the R & B Fund, in the sum of \$12.00 be cancelled and scrip in lieu thereof, be issued, for the same amount, for the same purpose, but on the R & B Special Fund.

On motion made by E. C. Smith, Seconded by P. H. McEown, with a vote unanimous, it is ordered by the court that Scrip # 1521 and 1531, issued to E. C. Smith, in the sums of \$50.00 & 33.34, respectively, issued out of the Gen. Co. Cur. Ex. Fund, be cancelled and scrip in lieu thereof, be issued for the same amounts, but be issued out of the R & B Cur. Ex. Fund.

On motion made by E. C. Smith, seconded by P. H. McEown, vote unanimous, it is ordered by the court that Scrip # 1027, 1158, 1529 & 1579, issued to R. W. Chapman, in the sum of \$15.00, \$15.00, \$15.00 & 13.87, respectively, Nos. 1027 and 1158 being issued out of the Gen. Co. "B" Fund and Nos. 1529 and 1579, being issued out of the Gen. Co. Cur. Ex. Fund, be cancelled and scrip in lieu thereof, be issued for the same amounts but on the R & B Current Ex. Fund.

On motion by E. C. Smith, seconded by P. H. McEown, with a vote unanimous, it is ordered by the court that Scrip # 1523, 1680, & 1270, in the amounts of \$23.85, \$34.05, & \$5.36 respectively, out of the R. & B. Cur. Ex. Gen. Co. Cur. Ex. and Gen. Co. "B", respectively, be cancelled and scrip in lieu thereof be issued for the same purposes, for the same amounts, but out of the R. & B. Cur. Expense Fund.
