There came on to be heard the petition of A. L. Walker and 126 other for a local option election in Commissioners' precinct No. 1, of Sabine County, and the matter having been referred to the Attorney General of Texas, for ruling and the Attorney General having ruled that a local option election could not be legally held in a dry County, the petition for the election is therefore, and for that reason denied.

It is ordered by the court that the Public road leading from old Highway 8 by the old Broom place to New Highway 8, and running thru W. R. Cousins pasture because the mail route has been rerouted and after consulting the people who live in that area/is/ordered discontinued as a public road and the gates now across said road may be closed.

It is ordered by the Court that Gen. County Script Reg. No. 3226 for the amount of \$100.00 payable to Mrs. Berta Harper be cancelled and two pieces issued in lieu thereof one for \$40.00 and one for \$60.00 be issued on the same fund payable to Mrs. Myrtle Arnold.

I, R. G. GOODRICH, a practical surveyor of 26 years experience in surveying in Sabine County, Texas, do hereby certify that I am familiar with the T. & N. O. R. R. Co. Survey, Number 16, in said County, and the subdivisions thereof; that the certificate number of said survey is number 569; that said survey was subdivided into two tracts, one of 298 acres which was sold by the State to W. H. Knox and patented to him under abstract number 401, and the other of 320 acres patented by the State of Henry Johnson under abstract Number 443, both tracts being described as parts of survey No. 16 T. & N. O. E. R. Co. Certificate number 569.

That Temple Lumber Company acquired 220 acres of the 298 acre tract, abstract number 401, and has duly rendered it and paid the taxes thereon as part of said T. & N. O. R. R. Survey #16, certificate #569.

That Temple Lumber Company also acquired 196.89 (197) acres of the 320 acre tract, which was abstract #443, and has rendered and paid the taxes on it as part of T. & N. O. R. R. Co., survey #16, certificate 569, but as abstract #401 when the abstract number should have been #443 and that by reason of having given the wrong abstract number, said 197 acres appears not to have been paid upon, and has been carried onto the delinquent rolls of said County, when in fact all taxes upon the said 197 acres are now paid.

WHEREAS, that in such event, it will be necessary to establish curing plants and take other steps to insure a market for such production, and;

WHEREAS, the Commissioner of Agriculture has never inspected the soil of Sabine County for diseases and given his consent for such farming venture, and;

WHEREAS, it is the understanding of the Commissioners' Court of said Sabine County, Texas, that such inspection be made and such permit be granted before sweet potatoes, sweet potato seed or sweet potato slips can be cetified;

THEREFORE, be it resolved by the Commissioners Court of said Sabine County, Texas, in regular session this, the 14 day of March, 1938, that the Hon. J. E. McDonald, Commissioner of Agriculture for the State of Texas be and is hereby invited to visit Sabine County, make all necessary inspections, advise with the County Agent, Vocational Teachers and other Agricultural Agencies existing in Sabine County and grant such permits if merited; or in the event the Hon. J. E. McDonald is unable to come that he send some accredited Representative of his Department.
