

Commissioners' Court met on Monday, August 8, 1938, with the following members present,

It is ordered by the court that Woodrow Russell's appointment as Deputy Public Weigher in
Precinct # 4, be confirmed.

The bond of W. E. Nethery as Public Weigher for Pre. # 4, was approved and the Bond of
Woodrow Russell as Deputy Weigher for Pre. # 4, was approved.

It is the order of the Court that Mrs. Myrtle Arnold be paid \$105.90 per month, to be paid
from same source as the other officer's salary's. Said amount to cover salary and expense in
connection with the job of co-worker. This order is made at this time because at the time of
Mrs. Arnold's appointment the Court neglected to make a formal order directing the amount and
manner of paying for salary.

It is the order of the Court that \$575.00 be paid to D. G. Mann to pay for the Sabine
County's part of the street paving job. \$287.50 to be issued against the Permanent Improvement
Fund, and \$287.50 to R. & B. Spl. Fund for Precinct # 1.

On this day came on for consideration before the court a petition presented to the Court
and signed by Carlos Travis and 72 others, residing within said Sabine County, Texas, and all
of whom are qualified voters in Sabine County, Texas, praying the court to order an election
to be held in Sabine County, Texas, to determine whether or not the sale of beer, containing
not more than 4 per cent of alcohol by weight, shall be legalized in said Sabine County.

And it appearing to the court that the petition presented was in all things regular, and that said petition contains the signatures of more than 10 per cent of the qualified voters of Sabine County, Texas, as reflected by the votes cast for Governor at the General Election in 1936.

Upon motion of Wrayton Speights, seconded by G. B. Carter, by unanimous vote, the court granted said petition and ordered same filed.

IT IS THE ORDER OF THE COURT that an election be held in all precincts in said Sabine County, Texas, at the regular voting precincts on Saturday, the 20th day of August, A. D. 1938, to determine whether the sale of beer, containing not more than 4 per cent of alcohol by weight, shall be legalized within the limits of Sabine County, Texas.


IT IS FURTHER ORDERED BY THE COURT that the clerk of this court issue and cause to be posted at least one notice of said election in each election precinct within Sabine County, Texas, for at least six (6) days prior to the 20th day of August, A. D. 1938;





AND IT IS FURTHER ORDERED That this election shall be held by the election officers selected by this court at the February Term, A. D. 1937, to hold General Elections in the County of Sabine, State of Texas, during the years 1937, and 1938.

The ballots used in said election shall conform to the requirements of Article 666, Subdivision 40, Penal Code of Texas, as amended.

The officers holding said election shall conform to the existing laws regulating general elections as near as possible, and after the poles are closed, they shall proceed to count the votes cast and make the report of said election to this court within three (3) days thereafter.

This being all the business, Court adjourned.
