WHEREAS, on the 16th day of October, 1939, a petition was presented to me by C. C. Rice, and 28 other persons of the Town of East Mayfield, Texas, praying that an election be ordered to be held in said Town for the purpose of determining whether or not the corporate existence of said town shall be abolished; and

IT APPEARING that the said petition bears the requisite number of qualified voters who are residents of said Town, and is in every respect in conformity with law; and

IT FURTHER APPEARING that all other facts set up in said petition are found to be true;

THEREFORE, I, O. A. Beauchamp, in my official capacity as County Judge of Sabine County, Texas, do hereby grant said petition and do hereby order that an election be held at Temple Store Bldg. in the Town of East Mayfield, Texas, on the 20th day of November, 1939, for the purpose of determining whether or not the corporate existence of said Town shall be abolished, under authority conferred by Article 1261, Chapter 19, Title 28, Revised Civil Statutes of Texas of 1925; and

I HEREBY APPOINT P. L. Brumfield and J. J. Cammack as Judges of said election, and the said P. L. Brumfield is designated as the Presiding Judge, and I also appoint D. D. Moses and John Arnett as Clerks to assist in holding said election.

EVERY PERSON entitled to vote at any general election under the laws of the State of Texas, regulating general elections, shall be allowed to vote.

THE BALLOTS to be used in said election shall have written or printed thereon "FOR THE ABOLITION OF THE CORPORATE EXISTENCE" and "AGAINST THE ABOLITION OF THE CORPORATE EXISTENCE".

EACH VOTER desiring to vote for the abolition of the corporate existence shall permit to remain on his or her ballot the words: "FOR THE ABOLITION OF THE CORPORATE EXISTENCE";

AND EACH VOTER desiring to vote against the abolition of the corporate existence, shall permit to remain on his or her ballot the words: "AGAINST THE ABOLITION OF THE CORPORATE EXISTENCE".

THE MANNER of holding said election shall be governed by the General Laws of the State of Texas, regulating general elections, except as otherwise provided by the statutes hereinabove referred to.

A COPY OF THIS ORDER shall be sufficient notice of the said election, and thirty (30) days notice of the time and place of holding said election shall be given by posting three written or printed notices of same at three public places in said Town and by publication thereof in four weekly issues of a newspaper of general circulation, published at least one year previous to the date of this order, in the County, and the date of the first publication thereof shall be thirty (30) days prior to the date of election.
