PETITION FOR ELECTION

COUNTY OF SABINE # TO THE HONORABLE COUNTY JUDGE OF SABINE COUNTY, TEXAS: We, the undersigned petitioners, respectfully represent:

1. That we are residents of the city or town of Hemphill, situated in Sabine County, Texas;
2. That we are qualified voters under Chapter 11, Title 28, Revised Statutes of Texas, 1925;
3. That the inhabitants of the said city or town desire that said city or town be incorporated for municipal purposes under the laws of the State of Texas;
4. That the boundaries of the said city or town, if it be incorporated, are described by metes and bounds as follows:

Beginning at a point on the E. bank of Cooper branch at the S. W. corner of a 36-7/10 acre survey owned by Mr. L. M. Knox;

8. That the name by which the city or town is to be known, if it be incorporated, shall be "City of Hemphill";

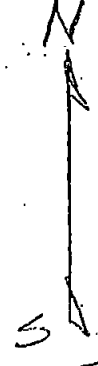

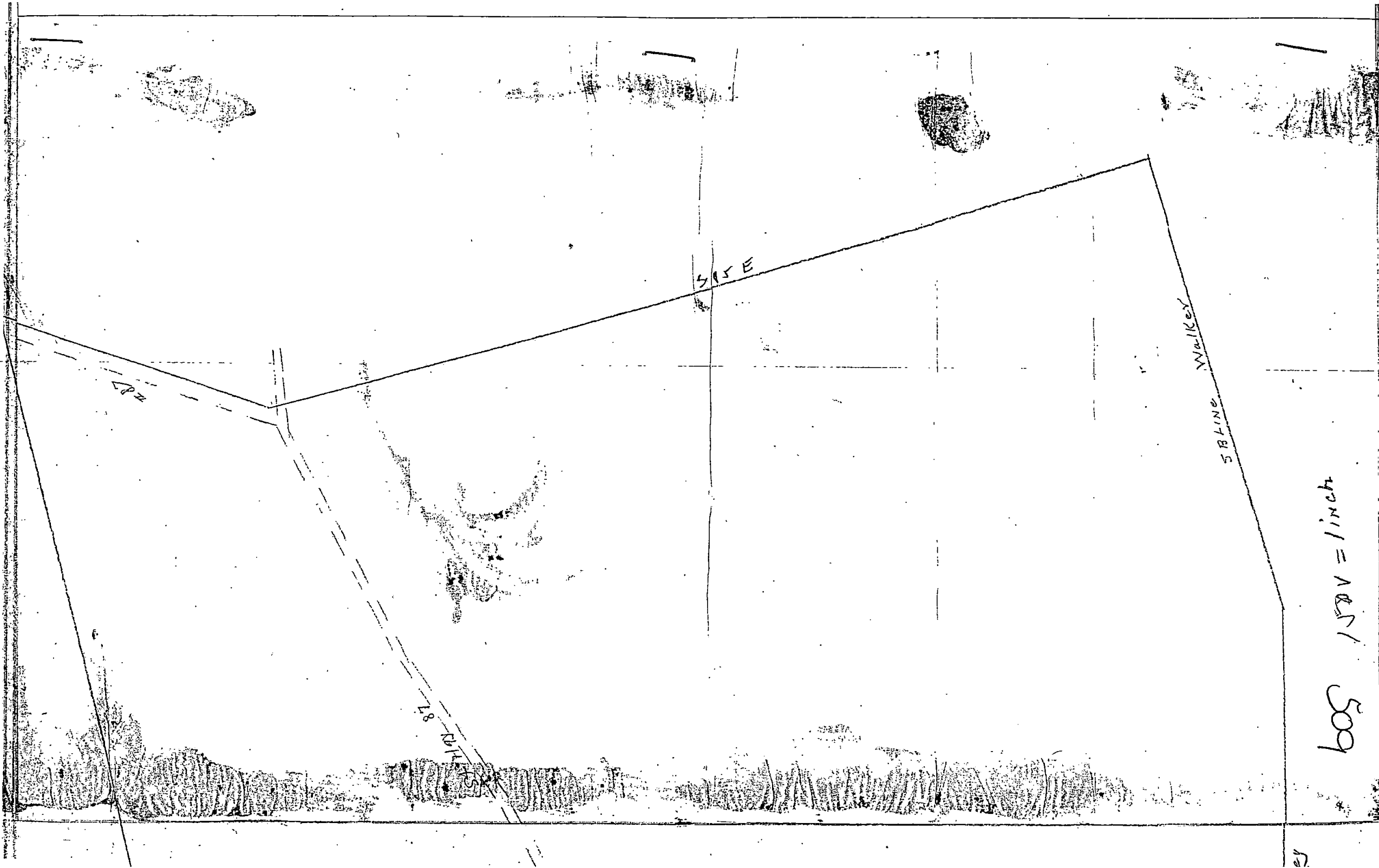

THE STATE OF TEXAS #

COUNTY OF SABINE # WHEREAS, on the 16 day of November, 1939, a petition was presented to me, by D. G. Mann, and 62 others, residing within the limits of the proposed City of Hemphill, Sabine County, Texas, hereinafter described by metes and bounds, praying that an election be ordered to be held in the territory described in said petition, for the purpose of submitting to a vote of the people therein, the question of whether said area shall be incorporated as a municipal corporation, as the City of Hemphill; and

It appearing that said petition is signed by more than 50 qualified voters who are resident of said proposed City of Hemphill; and that said petition states the boundaries of said proposed City and the name by which it is to be known when incorporated; and that a plat of said proposed City accompanied said petition, including therein no territory except that which is intended to be used strictly for City purposes; and

It further appearing and after satisfactory proof to me, as County Judge of Sabine County, Texas, it is so found that the limits of the proposed City of Hemphill contain more than six hundred and less than ten thousand inhabitants; and

It further appearing and it is so found, that said petition is in every respect in conformity with the law and that the facts stated therein are true and correct;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, O. A. Beauchamp, in my official capacity as County Judge of Sabine County, Texas, do hereby grant said petition and do hereby order that an election be held at Fire Station building, within the limits of said proposed City of Hemphill, on the 29 day of November, 1939, for the purpose of determining whether the area hereinafter described by metes and bounds shall be incorporated as a municipal corporation, the name by which it is to be known being, the "City of Hemphill", in accordance with and under and by virtue of Chapter 11, of Title 28, of the Revised Civil Statutes of 1925, of the State of Texas, and all laws and amendments relating thereto.

It is further ordered that J. H. Ener be, and he is hereby appointed Presiding officer of said election, who shall select two judges and two clerks to assist in holding said election; and

That said election shall be held in the manner prescribed for holding elections in other cases, and in accordance with the laws of the State of Texas; and

That every person who has attained the age of twenty-one years and who has resided within the limits of the proposed City of Hemphill in Sabine County, Texas, for the six months next preceding, and who is a qualified elector under the laws of this State, shall be entitled to vote at said election;

That those who are in favor of incorporating said proposed City of Hemphill for municipal purposes shall have written or printed upon their ballots, the word,

"CORPORATION"

and those who are opposed shall have written or printed on their ballots the words,

"NO CORPORATION"

That the territory proposed to be incorporated is described as follows:

Beginning at a point on the E. bank of Cooper branch at the S. W. corner of a 36-7/10 acre survey owned by Mrs. L. M. Knox;

I HEREBY APPOINT J. H. ENER, to serve as presiding officer at said election, and he is authorized and directed to select two judges and two clerks to assist in holding the same.

Ten days' notice of the time and place of holding the said election shall be given by posting notices thereof in three public places in said city and by publication thereof in two weekly issues of a newspaper of general circulation in the County, and the date of the first publication shall be ten full days prior to the date of said election.

Funds other than that impounded by Federal Court Judgment and that the County Judge shall receive \$150.00 per month, 75 per cent of which shall be paid from the same source as Commissioners' Salaries and the remainder from same source as other County officers. The County Treasurer shall receive as salary a commission of 2 1/2 per cent of all monies paid into the treasury and the same per cent on all monies paid out of the treasury until his compensation shall reach \$2000.00. All fees and commissions as the law allows him, and it is specifically ordered by the Court that the current collections for the General County Fund be deposited as heretofore ordered by previous Commissioner's Court and shall be used to pay current salaries of County Officers where salaries are ordered to be paid out of General Fund. And the sum total of Current Collections for the General Fund is hereby appropriated to pay current salaries from said Fund. And it is ordered by the Court that all receipts from Car Registration be deposited as heretofore in R. & B. Social Fund and that the following amounts are specifically appropriated and shall be

held in said fund for that purpose:

This being all the business, Court adjourned.
