TO THE HONORABLE COMMISSIONERS COURT OF SABINE COUNTY, TEXAS: We, the undersigned citizens of Sabine County, Texas, being the owners of all the lands within the hereinafter described boundaries, respectfully petition your Honorable Body that the territory included within the boundaries hereinafter set out, be attached to and included within the boundaries of the stock law as now in effect within the subdivision covered by the city limits of the city of Hemphill, the boundaries of the subdivision to which this petition applies and which is asked to be attached to and included within the subdivision mentioned above being as follows:

Beginning on the south boundary line of the city of Hemphill, which is the S. B. line of the Joseph Walker headright survey, at the extreme eastern corner of a tract of 3 acres of land, more or less, in the John Haley survey now owned by A. H. McDaniel. Thence in a northwesterly direction with the S. B. line of said city of Hemphill and said Joseph Walker survey, to a point in the S. B. line of a 10-acre tract in said Joseph Walker survey owned by Dr. E. G. Smith, which point is the N. W. corner of a tract of land owned by T. V. Parker. Thence in a southerly direction with the west boundary line of lands owned by T. V. Parker and P. S. Goen to the N. W. corner of 10.96 acres of land in the John Haley survey owned by C. B. Clark, and continuing same course with the W. B. line of said Clark tract and a tract of 16-acres owned by A. M. Jones, to the S. W. corner of said Jones 16 acres. Thence in an easterly direction with Jones S. B. line to his S. E. corner on the west margin of right-of-way of Highway #87. Thence northerly with west margin of said right-of-way to a point immediately west of and across said highway from the S. W. corner of said A. H. McDaniel 3-acre tract. Thence eastwardly across said highway and with the south boundary line of said A. H. McDaniel 3 acre tract to the place of beginning. And also an additional tract, belonging to P. S. Goen containing 16 acres, bounded on the north by the above described 3 acre tract of A. H. McDaniel, and on the west by Highway 87.
