

Hon. Commissioners' Court met on Monday, May 27, 1940, in regular session, with all members present, to-wit:

Accounts were allowed as shown in "Accounts Allowed".

It is ordered by the Court that the County Treasurer buy from P. M. Coussons Gen Funding Warrant No. 58 at a price of 70 for the sinking funds of County Wide Road Bonds.

The Court went into Board of Equalization, took the oath and set May 30th, as the day to begin considering assessments:

"I, O. A. Beauchamp, Judge, D. B. Speights, Commissioner Prec. # 1, J. T. Ener, Com'r. Pre. # 2, G. B. Carter, Com'r. Pre. # 3, and A. L. Harvill, Com'r. Pre. # 4, members of the board of equalization of Sabine County, for the year A. D. 1939, hereby solemnly swear that in the performance of my duties as a member of such board for said year, I will not vote to allow any taxable property to stand assessed on the tax rolls of said county for said year at any sum which I believe to be less than its true market value, or, if it has no market value then its real value; that I will faithfully endeavor and as a member of said board will move to have each item of taxable property which I believe to be assessed for said year at less than its true market value, or real value, raised on the tax rolls to what I believe to be its true cash market value, if it has a market value, and if not, then to its real value; and that I will faithfully endeavor to have the assessed valuation of all property subject to taxation within said county stand upon the tax rolls of said county for said year at its true cash market value or, if it has no market value, then its real value. I further solemnly swear that I have read and understand the provisions contained in the Constitution and laws of this State relative to the valuation of taxable property, and that I will faithfully perform all the duties required of me under the Constitution and laws of this State. So help me God."

This being all the business, Court adjourned.
