

Sabine County's Commissioner's Court met in a special Session on March 17, 1946, at the Court House with the following members present, to-wit: Chas. Forse, Co. Judge, H. J. Hamilton, Commissioner Precinct #1, Everett Smith, Commissioner Precinct #2, B. E. Marshburn, Commissioner Precinct #3 and T. L. Arnold, Commissioner.

The Commissioners Court named the following roads listed according to their importance to Sabine County to be built by the State Highway Department as Farm to Market Roads.

Precinct #2

Beginning at Yellowpine at Highway #87 going south 3 miles by Dan Easley's place. Beginning at Hemphill on Fairdale road continue East as far as possible.

Precinct #4

From Geneva to Sexton, approximately 6 miles. From State Highway #21 to State Highway #87

Precinct #1.

From Hemphill to Pineland approximately 10 miles.

Precinct #3.

From 1 mile south of Bronson on State Highway #96 via Centerview School Back to Highway #96 at Cousins Park, approximately 6 miles.

The Court expressed deep interest in State Highway #87 being built south of Hemphill but not considered as a Farm to Market Road.

There being no further business, Court Adjourned.
