Hamilton, Commissioner Precinct No. 1, Everett Smith, Commr. Precinct 2, B. E. Marshburn, Commissioner Precinct #3, and T. L. Arnold, Commr. Precinct #4.

Accounts were allowed as are shown by the Minutes of accounts Allowed.

TO THE HONORABLE COMMISSIONER'S COURT OF SABINE COUNTY, TEXAS;

GENTLEMEN:

We, J. H. Conn, and Kathleen Conn, both of Sabine County, Texas, being the resident owners of the hereinafter described lands, which adjoin lands in which a hog downnow prevails and in which hogs, sheep and goats are not permitted to run at large, hereby petition your honorable body to include the following lands and territory in said stock law territory, and that you pass an order extending said stock law forbidding the running at large of hogs, goats and sheep in such territory, which territory is described as follows:

Beginning at a point on Pologocho Creek at the N. W. corner of a 58½ acre tract owned by J. H. Conn; thence south with the west line of said 58½ acres to the N. W. corner of the J. E. Fenley 58½ acres; thence east with said line between J. E. Fenley and J. H. Conn to the N. E. corner of J. E. Fenley's 58½ acres on the west line of the J. H. Conn 70 acres; thence south with the west line of the said J. H. Conn 70 acres to the Tebo Creek; thence down Tebo Creek with its meanders to the S. E. Corner of the place known as the Mattie T. Conn place owned by Kathleen Conn; thence north with the east line of said Mattie T. Conn place to the Pologocho Creek; thence up said Pologocho Creek with its meanders to the place of beginning.
