

The Honorable Commissioners' Court met at the Regular Meeting Place on Monday, Nov. 28, 1949 with the following members present, to-wit: O.A. Beauchamp, County Judge, G.B. Conn, Comm. Prec. #1, E.C. Smith, Comm. Prec. #2, J.R. Thomas, Comm. Prec. #3, H.J. Vickers, Comm. Prec. #4, and Floyd Smith, County Clerk.

The returns of a Stock Law Election held Nov. 26, 1949 at Lone Starr Schoolhouse, parts of Precinct No. 3 & 11, Sabine County, Texas were canvassed in the presence of all members of the court, R.F. Davison, Justice of the Peace, Prec. #1, Sam Solly and Henry Butler, and are as follows, to-wit:

RETURNS OF A STOCK LAW ELECTION

TO THE COUNTY JUDGE OF SABINE COUNTY, TEXAS:

We, the undersigned officers, holding an election on the 26th day of November A.D. 1949, at Long Star Schoolhouse, in Precinct No. 11, Sabine County, Texas, for the purposes of determining whether hogs, sheep and goats shall be permitted to run at large within the territorial limits of field notes of part Precinct No. 11 & 3 Sabine County, Texas, hereby certify that at said election there were cast 17 votes, of which number there were cast:

"FOR THE STOCK LAW" 16 votes

"AGAINST THE STOCK LAW" 1 votes

MAJORITY 15 THE STOCK LAW 16 votes

ORDER DECLARING RESULT OF
STOCK LAW ELECTION

THE STATE OF TEXAS # IN THE COMMISSIONERS' COURT
COUNTY OF SABINE # OF SABINE COUNTY:

On this, the 28 day of Nov. A.D. 1949, came on to be considered the returns of an election held on the 26 day of Nov. A.D. 1949, in parts of Election Precincts No. 3 & 11, of this County, upon the question of determining whether ~~goats~~^{hogs}, sheep and goats shall be permitted to run at large in certain territorial limits, more particularly described as follows:

Beginning at the point where the south boundary line of the Larkin Groce League crosses the center line of U.S. Highway No. 96; thence southwardly with the center line of said U.S. Highway No. 96 to the Popano Creek, being the first creek on said highway south of the said Groce League; thence up said Popano Creek with its meanders to the G.W. Nerren original 125 acre subdivision of the A.E.C. Johnson and Samuel Nelson Surveys; thence easterly with the south line of said Nerren 125 acre subdivision to the west or northwest line of the said Samuel Nelson survey; thence northeasterly with the west or northwest lines of the said Nelson Survey and the James McKim Survey to the east line of the Larkin Groce League; thence northerly with the east line of the Larkin Groce League to the N.E. corner of Block No. 36 of the L.F. Bacon sub-

division; thence westerly with the North line of Blocks 36, 35 and 34 of said Bacon Subdivision to the N.W. corner of Block No. 34 in the east line of Block No. 29; thence north with the east line of Block No. 29 to the N.E. corner of said Block No. 29, being the most easterly S.E. corner of the City of Pineland, Texas; thence N. 77 W. 858 vrs to the N.W. corner of the City of Pineland, Texas; thence N 77 W 858 vrs to the N.W. corner of Block No. 28 of said Bacon Subdivision, being another corner of the City of Pineland; thence S 13 W 526 vrs to S.W. corner of said Block No. 28, being also a corner of the City of Pineland; thence N 77 W 723 vrs to the N.W. corner of Block No. 30 of said Bacon Subdivision in the east right of way line of the G.C.&S.F.Ry.Co.; thence N 13 E with said east line of said railroad right of way 54 vrs to corner; thence west 33-1/3 to the center of the right of way of said railroad; thence N 77 W 722 vrs to the S W corner of the said City of Pineland, Texas; thence N 13 E with the west line of the City of Pineland to the center of Farm to Market Highway No. 1; thence westerly with the center of said highway to the intersection of said Farm to Market highway with the center line of U.S. highway No. 96; thence south with the center line of said U.S. Highway No. 96 to the south line of Block No. 3 of said Bacon Subdivision; thence westerly with the south line of said Block No. 3 to the east line of the C.W.Easley survey; thence north with Easley's east line to the N E corner of said Easley Survey; thence westerly with Easley's north line to the N. W. corner of said survey; thence south with the west line of said survey to its S W corner on the north line of the Ben Lindsey League; thence westerly with the north line of said Lindsey league to the Sabine and San Augustine County line; thence southerly with the meanders of said county line to the south line of the Ben Lindsey League; thence easterly with the south line of said Ben Lindsey League and the south line of the Earkin Moore League to the place of beginning.

And it appearing that said election was in all respects legally held and that said returns were duly and legally made and that there were cast at said election 17 votes, of which number there were cast:

FOR THE STOCK LAW 16 votes

AGAINST THE STOCK LAW 1 votes

And it appearing to the Court from said returns that a majority of the legally qualified voters of said District, voting at said election, voted FOR THE STOCK LAW, the Court does hereby declare the proposition to have been adopted, and after the expiration of thirty days from the date of this proclamation it shall be unlawful to permit hogs, sheep and goats to run at large within the limits hereinbefore designated.

It is the order of the Commissioners' Court that the County Treasurer be, and he is hereby, instructed to transfer the balance of \$270.19 remaining in the account of Road District #2, to the General Fund.

It is further ordered that the County Treasurer be and he is hereby instructed to transfer the sum of \$141.00 from the General Fund to The Trial Fee Fund. And It Is Further Ordered that the Treasurer transfer the sum of \$108.05 from the General Fund to the Road Cons't. Fund, and that the sum of \$178.83 be transferred from the General Fund to the Medical Fund.

It is the order of the Commissioners' Court that a warrant, drawn on the General Fund of Sabine County, be issued in the amount of \$67.50 and payable to First State Bank, Hemphill, in lieu of warrants numbers: 18075, 18805, 18915 and 19714.

And it is also ordered that a warrant shall be issued in the amount of \$179.20, drawn on the General Fund, payable to First State Bank, Hemphill, in lieu of warrants numbers 18011, 18012, 18009 and 18010.

And it is also ordered that a warrant in the amount \$1500.00 be issued against the General Fund, and payable to First State Bank, Hemphill, in lieu of warrants numbers 16774, 16775, 16776,

16777 and 16778.

And the County Treasurer is directed to cancel the warrants numbers 18075, 18805, 18915, 19714, 18011, 18012, 18009, 18010, 16774, 16775, 16776, 16777 and 16778 aggregating \$1746.70

Accounts were allowed as are shown by the "Minutes of the Accounts," there being no other business, Court adjourned.
