

The Honorable Commissioners' Court met at the Regular Meeting Place on Monday February 13, 1950 with the following^N members present, to-wit: O. A. Beauchamp, County Judge; G. B. Conn, Comm. Prec. #1; E. C. Smith, Comm. Prec. #2; J. R. Thomas, Comm. Prec. #3; H. J. Vickers, Comm. Prec. #4 and Floyd Smith, County Clerk.

It is hereby ordered by the Commissioners' Court that the Tax Collector accept \$433.74 as full payment of taxes on 265 acres of the Sion Smith League from J. L. Payne, and the Tax Collector is directed to withhold from the above amt. the full amount due the State of Texas.

BE IT RESOLVED:

WHEREAS, according to the State Department of Health records, malaria exists in our county, and whereas Sabine County has been approved by CDC Activities for a Malaria Control Program.

THEREFORE, be it resolved (1) that the Commissioners' Court, this day in session, go on record agreeing to assist and cooperate with the State Department of Health in a Malaria Control Program for the county during the last quarter of the fiscal year 1950, beginning April 1, 1950, by furnishing the following:

1. The County will furnish one labore~~rr~~per crew to operate truck and spray equipment in areas to be agreed upon with said county.

2. The County will set aside \$50.00 per month per spray crew employed with which the County will defray operating and maintenance cost of crew vehicle and equipment. Any portion of this allocation not expended during the current month will be available for expenditure during succeeding months of operation.

3. The county will replace in kind such chemicals as may be advanced by the State Department of Health at the close of each month of operation, upon notice from the Area Supervisor.

Provided that the following items are furnished through the State Department of Health:

A. One vehicle per crew.

B. Spray equipment used.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the Court reserve the right to partially defray its share of expense of the Cooperative Malaria Control program by the assessment of a fee to be agreed upon by the Area Supervisor and Commissioners' Court. Any deficiency over and above the fees collected shall be borne^{by} the County.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: that the spraying of outbuildings such as barns, Chicken houses, etc. be recognized as beyond the scope of the Malaria Control program and that appropriate charges over and above the basic dwelling be assessed for spraying such buildings to defray the complete cost of such work.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the assessments shall be collected by the County employee of each crew and deposited with the County Treasurer. The responsibility of funds collected shall repose at all times with the county.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED: That the County require all personnel to be covered and keep in force while employed on Malaria control program a minimum of \$5,000-\$10,000 Bodily Injury Liability and \$5,000 Property Damage Liability Automobile Insurance while driving any Government owned vehicles.
