COUNTY OF SABINE It is the order of the Sabine County Commissioners' Court that Sabine County be redistricted into four (4) Justice Precincts instead of into eight (8) as it now exists.

It is ordered that Precinct No. 1 as it now exists be combined with and include Precinct No. 7 as it now exists, and that hereafter the Precinct will be called Hemphill Precinct No. 1.

-2-

It is the Order of the Court that Frecinct No. 2 shall include the now existing Precincts 4,5, and 8; that all of these three Precincts be combined, and that the Geneva Precinct No. 2 as it will be called, shall extend co-extensive with the O₁, ter Boundaries of each of said old precincts numbered 4,5 and 8.

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-4-

It is ordered that the precinct now called No. 2, Pineland, shall be combined with Brookeland Precinct No. 3 as it now exists, and that the newly formed precinct shall be called Pineland Precinct No. 3.

It is ordered that the old precinct N_0 . 6 boundaries remain the same as originally described and that said precinct shall hereafter be called Bronson Precinct No. 4.

IT IS UNDERSTOOD that the legally elected and qualified Justices-of-the-Peace and Constable in each of the four newly numbered Justice Precints shall remain in office in the Justice Precinct in which they reside until their successors are elected and qualified.

There shall be continuous terms of Court in each of said four precincts and the next day after return day of service shall be called a regular term of the Court.

Done this 10 day of January, A.D. 1949.

And whereas, the Commissioners' Court intended that the Justice of the Peace, E. F. McDonald, theretofore elected to such office in old Pineland Precinct $N_{
m O}$. 2 and the Constable, G. W. Russell, Jr. the elected Constable in old Justice Precinct No. 2, should be appointed as Justice of the Peace and Constable, respectively, for the new Pineland Precinct No. 3 to serve until January 1, 1951, and it was intended by the Court that R. F. Davidson, the duly elected Justice of the Peace in Precinct No. 1 and Abron Williams, the duly elected Constable in $P_{
m p}$ ecinct No. 1 should be appointed Justice of the Peace and Constable, respectively, in the new Justice Precinct No. 1 to serve until the 1st day of January, A.D. 1951, but the order, as drawn and recorded, does not make such intention clear and the order, as intended to be drawn and recorded, appointed said officers to fill said offices for the remainder of the term ending January 1, 1951, and it is the desire of the Court that an order shall now be entered nunc pro tunc making such appointments as of January 10, 1949.

It is, therefore, ordered by the Court, by unanimous vote, that E.F. McDonald the forme Justice of the Peace of Old Paneland Precinct No. 2, be and he is hereby appointed as Justice of the Peace as the newly created Pineland Precinct No. 3 to serve as such until January 1, 1951; it is further ordered by unanimous vote of the Court that G. W. Russell, Jr., former Constable of the Old Pineland Precinct No. 2 is hereby appointed Constable of the newly created P_1 neland P_p ecinct No. 3 to serve until January 1, 1951; and it is further ordered by the Gourt by unanimous vote that R. F. Davidson, former J stice of the Pace of the Old Hemphill Precinct No. 1, be and he is hereby appointed Justice of the Peace of the newly created Hemphill Precinct No. 1 to serve until January 1, 1951; and it is further ordered by unanimous vote that Abron Williams, former Constable of the Old Hemphill Precinct Notes , be and he is hereby appointed Constable of the newly created H mphill Precinct No. 1 to serve until the 1st day of January A.D. 1951; and it is further ordered that these appointments are here now entered asof the 10th day of January, A.D. 1949 and they are intended to be effective from said date when they were in fact appointed by the Court."
