COUNTY OF SABINE | On this the 12th day of June, 1950, the Commissioners' Court of Sabine County, State of Texas, convened in regular session at the regular meeting place thereof, with the following members of said Court present, to-wit:

and the following members absent: None _____ constituting a quorum, and among other proceedings had, said Commissioners' Court passed the following order:

WHEREAS, on the 20th day of May, 1950, an election was held in the Sexton Common School District No. 24 of Sabine County, Texas, and Shelbyville Rural High School District No. 41, of Shelby County, Texas, for the purpose of determining whether said Districts shall be consolidated for school purposes; and

WHEREAS, a majority of the legally qualified voters of said Districts voting at said election voted in favor of consolidating said School Districts with each other for school purposes;

THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED BY THE COMMISSIONERS' COURT OF SABINE COUNTY, TEXAS, that the Sexton Common School District No. 24, of Sabine County, Texas and Shelbyville Rural High School District No. 41 of Shelby County, Texas, are hereby consolidated and said consolidated District shall hereafter be known as Shelbyville Rural High School District No. 41, of Shelby County, Texas, and is by this order established within the following metes and bounds, to-wit:

Being an area comprising the Shelbyville Rural High School District No. 41, Shelby County, Texas, and Sexton Common School District of Sabine County, Texas and being described by metes and bounds as follows, to-wit:
