ORDER DECLARING RESULT OF STOCK LAW ELECTION

COUNTY OF SABINE | IN THE COMMISSIONERS' COURT OF SABINE COUNTY:

On this, the 28 day of Aug. A.D.1950, came on to considered the returns of an election held on the 29 day of July, A.D.1950, in Milam, Precinct No. 4, Sabine County, upon the question of determining whether horses, mules, jacks, jennets and cattle shall be permitted to run at large in certain territorial limits, more particularly described as follows: "SEE NOTICE OF ELECTION"

And it appearing that said election was in all respects legally held and that said returns were duly and legally made and that there were cast at said election 87 votes, of which number there were cast:

FOR THE STOCK LAW 35 Votes

AGAINST THE STOCK LAW 52 Votes

And it appearing to the Court from said returns that a majority of the legally qualified voters of said District, voting at said election, voted AGAINST THE STOCK LAW the Court does hereby declare the proposition to have been defeated.
