



BEGINNING at the point where the County line between Sabine County and Shelby County intersects Martinez Bayou on the Jos. W. Brightman survey; thence in Southwesterly direction with and following the County line between Sabine and Shelby County to the N.W. corner of Sabine County at the point on the W.S. Smith survey, where the Sabine and Shelby County line the Shelby County and San Augustine County line, and the San Augustine and Sabine County line all coverage; Thence South with the Sabine and San Augustine County line to the North line of the E. A. Lloyd Survey; Thence east with said Lloyd N. line to the N.E. corner of said Lloyd Survey; Thence South with Lloyd's E. line to the S.W. corner of the Francis Richards Survey on the N. line of the David Renfro League; Thence N. 85 E. with the N. line of said David Renfro League to its N.E. corner; thence South 5 W. with the East line of said Renfro League to the N. W. corner of the J.D. Jones survey; Thence S. 88 E. with N. line of said Jones survey and the South line of the Jose Alameda survey to the extreme Southeast corner of said Alameda Survey, being one of the corners of the S.P. Tatom survey; Thence N. 24 E. with Alameda E. line to the extreme corner of said Alameda Survey on the South line of the John McAdams survey; thence South 65 East with McAdams South line to its S.E. corner on the West line of the Wm. Defee Survey, abstract 86; Thence N. 25 E. with the West line of said Defee Survey and the W. line of the Richard Slaughter League to the N.W. corner of said Richard Slaughter League; Thence South 65 E. with Slaughter N. line to the Southwest corner of the W.B. Frazier survey; Thence N. 25 E. with the West line of said W.B. Frazier Survey and the West line of the Philip Smith survey to the Martinez Bayou; Thence up said Martinez Bayou with its meanders to the place of beginning.

Which said petition was filed in this Court on the 28th day of May, A.D. 1951; and it appearing to the Court that said petition, signed by twenty (20) or more legally qualified freeholders of said subdivision:

Upon motion of Commissioner W. E. Glover and seconded by Commissioner H.J. Vickers and carried by vote of 4 to 0 it is ordered by the Court that an election be held in said subdivision on the 18th day of August, A.D. 1951, for the purpose of determining whether hogs, sheep and goats shall be permitted to run at large within the limits of said subdivision.

ORDER OF COUNTY JUDGE:

THE STATE OF TEXAS

COUNTY OF SABINE I, O.A. Beauchamp, County Judge of Sabine County, Texas in pursuance of the Statutes of the State of Texas, made and provided, do hereby order an election to be held for the purpose of determining whether hogs, sheep and goats shall be permitted to run at large within the following described subdivision of Sabine County, Texas, to-wit:

Beginning at the point where the County Line between Sabine County and Shelby county intersects Martinez Bayou on the Jos. W. Brightman survey; thence in Southwesterly direction with and following the County line between Sabine and Shelby County to the N.W. corner of Sabine County at the point on the W.S.Smith survey, where the Sabine and Shelby County, line, the Shelby County and San Augustine County line, and the San Augustine County Line and Sabine County line all converge; Thence South with the Sabine and San Augustine County line to the North line of the E. A. Lloyd Survey; Thence East with said Lloyd N. line to the N.E. corner of said Lloyd survey; Thence South with Lloyd's E. line to the S. W. corner of the Francis Richards survey on the N. line of the David Renfro League; Thence N. 85 E. with the N. line of said David Renfro League to its N.E. corner; Thence South 5 W. with the East line of said Renfro League to the N.W. corner of the J.D.Jones survey; thence S. 88 E. with the N. line of said Jones Survey and the South line of the Jose Alameda Survey to the extreme Southeast corner of said Alameda survey, being one of the corners of the S.P.Tatom survey; Thence N. 24 E. with Alameda E. line to the extreme East corner of said Alameda survey on the South line of the John McAdams survey; Thence South 65 East with McAdams South line to its S.E. corner on the West line of the Wm. DeFee survey, Abstract 86; Thence N. 25 E. with the West line of said DeFee Survey and the W. line of Richard Slaughter League to the N.W. corner of said Richard Slaughter League; Thence South 65 E. with Slaughter N. line to the Southwest corner of the W.B.Frazier Survey; Thence N. 25 E. with the West line of said W.B. Frazier Survey and the west line of the Philip Smith survey to the Martinez Bayou; Thence up said Martine Bayou with its meanders to the Place of beginning.

Said election shall be held on the 18th day of August, A.D. 1951. and the voting shall be at the Sexton Schoolhouse within said subdivision and D.B. Polley, Sr. and Mrs. Annie Ballard are hereby named Managers of said election and they shall select the necessary assistants and they are hereby directed to hold said elections.

Only persons who reside in the above described subdivision and who are freeholders and qualified voters under the Constitution of Laws of the State of Texas, shall vote at said election.

The vote at said election shall be by ballot, which shall have written thereon the following: "FOR THE STOCK LAW" "AGAINST THE STOCK LAW".

Those desiring to prevent animals designated in the above order from running at large shall place upon their ballots the words "FOR THE STOCK LAW": and those in favor of allowing such animals to run at large shall place upon their ballots the words "AGAINST THE STOCK LAW".

Said polling place shall be opened at 8:00 o'clock A.M. and closed at 7:00 o'clock P.M.

On this the 9th day of July, A.D. 1951, came on for consideration the petition of D.S. Ansley and ten (10) other filed with this Court on May 7, 1951, requesting that this Court include the lands and territory therein described in the stock law territory and that this

Court pass an order extending the stock law forbidding of running at large all hogs, sheep and goats to such territory, said petition including the territory described therein being as follows:

April 23, 1951

TO THE HONORABLE COMMISSIONERS' COURT OF SABINE COUNTY, TEXAS:

We, the undersigned, constituting a majority of the owners of the hereinafter described lands which adjoin lands in which a stock law now prevails and in which hogs, sheep and goats are forbidden to run at large, hereby petition your honorable body to include the following lands and territory in said stock law territory and that you pass an order extending the stock law forbidding the running at large of hogs, sheep and goats to such territory, which is described as follows:

Beginning at the point where a public road crosses the N. line of the Own Lindsey Survey, which point is the Southwest corner of a 26 acre tract of land formerly known as the J.G. Russell 26 acres and later owned by J.W. Minton and J.H. Minton, being also the S.E. corner of a tract of land owned by Temple Lumber Company; Thence Westerly with the North line of said Owan Lindsay Survey to the Northeast corner of 67.2 acres known as the A.T. Perry land; Thence Southerly with Perry's East line to S.E. corner; Thence Westerly with Perry's South line to Southwest corner; Thence Northerly and Northwesterly with the West line of the Perry 67.2 acres on the Lindsey survey with the Perry 87.5 acres on the Martin White League to the Southwest corner of the Dick Barlow 30 acres acquired from Mrs. Rena Crouch; Thence Northwesterly with the Westerly line of said Barlow 30 acres, and the West line of 70 acres purchased by Temple Lumber Company from Mrs. Rena Crouch, to the Southwest corner of the G.L. Beauchamp 73 acre tract; Thence Northeasterly with the line between the Beauchamp 73 acres and the Temple Lumber Company's 70 acres to Sandy Creek; Thence up Sandy Creek with its meanders to the Southwest corner of the T.I. Burr 24 acres; Thence East with Burr's South line to the Northwest corner of 40 acres owned by T.I. Burr; Thence Southezly with Burr's West line to his Southwest corner; Thence Easterly with Burr's South line to his Southeast corner in the West line of the Nona Mills 99.5 acres; Thence Southerly to the Southwest corner of said Nona Mills tract, being the Northwest corner of a tract owned by Willie Wright and wife, and Mrs. Cynthia Wright; Thence Easterly with the N. line of said Wright tract to its Northeast corner; Thence Southerly with Willie Wright's East line to his Southeast corner; in public road; Thence Westerly with said public road to the Northwest corner of the Dave Hall 55 acres, now owned by J.M. Yolton and wife; Thence Southerly with the line between the Dave Hall 55 acres and the original J.J. Crouch 45 acres, to the Southwest corner of said Hall tract and the Southeast corner of said Crouch tract in the North line of the D.S. Ansley 35 acres; Thence Easterly to Bear Creek; Thence down Bear Creek with its meanders to the Southeast corner of said Ansley 35 acres, being the N.E. corner of the J.G. Russell 26 acre tract above mentioned; Thence Westerly with Ansley's South line and the Russell North line to Public road; Thence Southeasterly with said Public road to the place of beginning.

Upon motion duly made by Commissioner H.J. Vickers and seconded by Commissioner J.R. Thomas and passed unanimously, It is ordered by the Court that said petition be in all things granted and that the stock law forbidding the running at Large of hogs, sheep and goats is hereby extended to include such territory and such territory is hereby declared to be included in territory wherein hogs, sheep and goats are forbidden to run at large, and from and after this date it shall be unlawful for hogs, sheep and goats to run at large in the territory described in the above petition.

There being no other business, <sup>we</sup> were adjourned.
