THAT WE, the undersigned, who are owners of real estate abutting and lying adjacent to that portion of the County Road, locally known as the Sabinetown Road, heroinafter referred to as Farm-to-Market Highway No. 1965, leading from the Easterly Right-of-Way line of State Hwy. 87 at Hemphill; Sabine County, Texas, in an easterly direction for a distance of 25,720 feet to road intersection.

For and in consideration of the construction of a first class public road within the hereinafter described right-of-way, have granted conveyod, appropriated, and dedicated to Sabine County, Texas all those certain tracts or parcels of land situated along the above designated public road in Sabine County, Texas within a right-of-way width of 80 feot, being 40 feet wide on each side of the centerline of proposed Farm-to-Market Hwy. No. 1965, from Hwy. Sta. No. $0 / 80$ to Hwy. Sta. No. $258 / 00$, as surveyed by the District Engineer of the State Highway Department of Texas, for a total distance of 25,720 feet. Said Centerline being more fully described as follows:

C. of a 6 deg. 001 curve; THENGE 629.1 feet around said 6'deg. curve having a central angle of 37 deg. $45^{\prime} \mathrm{right}$ and a tangent distance of 326.6 feet; THENCE $S$. 81 deg. 25' E. 662.9 feet to the P.C. of a 1 deg. $00^{\prime}$ curve; THENCE 245.0 feet around said 1 deg. curve having a central angle of 2 deg. $27^{\prime}$ left and a tangent distance of 222.5 feet; THENCE S. 83 deg. $52^{\prime}$ E. 657.8 feet to the P. C. of a 1 deg. $30^{\prime}$ curve; THENCE 607.8 feet around said 1 deg. $30^{\prime}$ curve having a central angle of 9 deg. $07^{\prime}$ left and a tangent distance of 304.5 feet; THENCE N. 87 deg. of' ${ }^{\prime}$. 3,409.6 feet to the P. C. of a l deg. OOI curve; THENCE 366.7 feet around said 1 deg. curve having a central angle of 3 deg. 401 left and a tangent distance of 183.4 feet; THENCE N. 83 deg. 21 : E. 890.8 feet to the. P.C. of a 4 deg. $00^{\prime}$ curve; THENCE 503.3 feet around said 4 deg. curve having a central angel of 20 deg. of right and a tangent distance of 254.3 feet; THENSE S. 76 deg. 31 E. 365.6 feat to the P. C. of a 7 deg. DO' curve: THENCE 480.7 feet around said 7 deg. curve having a central angle of 33 deg. 391 left and a tangent distance of 247.4 feet; THENGE 69 deg. 501. E. 508.9 feet to the intersection of Forest Service RoaddNo. 115, Farm-to-Market Hwy. No. 1965 Sta. No. 258/00.

It is the desire and intention of each of the undersigned land owners to dedicate for public road purposes all real estate lying within the above described right-of-way; however, the said undersigned land owners respectively reserve and except to themselves, their heirs and assigns, all gas, oil and sulphur in and under respective parcels of land herein dedicated for such right-of-way but waive all rights of ingress and egress thereon for the purpose* of exploring, mining or drilling for same,

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD, the above described premises, subject to the mineral reservations above stated, together with all and singular rights and appurtenances thereto in anywise belonging unto the said Sabine County, Texas and its' assigns, and we, the under-signed land owners herein bind ourselves, our heirs, executors and administrators to warrant and
forever defend, all and singular the said premises unto the said Sabine County, Texas, and it's assigns, against every person whomsoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof.

And it appearing to the court that the persons named in said instrument are owners of real estate abutting and lying adjacent to that portion of the County Road, locally known as the Sabinetown Road, hereinafter referred to as Farm-to-Market Highway No. 1965 , leading from the easterly right-of-way line of State Hwy. 87 at Hemphill, Sabine County, Texas, in an easterly direction for a distance of 25,720 feet to a road intersection. And that they and each of them by signing said instrument, having expressly decleared that it is the desire and intention of each of them to dedicate for public road purposes all real estate lying within an 80 feet right of way described therein, in order that a first class public road can be constructed and maintained within said described right of way. IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DEGREED BY the Commissioners Court of Sabine, County, Texas, that the grant and dedication of said 80 feet right of way described in said ingtrument'set forth above to Sabine County Texas be and'the same is hereby accepted and said right of way shall hereafter constitute a first class public road and shall be available to the Texas Highway Department for the construction of the proposed Farm-to-Market Highway No. 1965.
