Notice of said election shall also be given by the publication of a copy of this order in a newspaper of general circulation published in this county on the same day in each of two suncessive weeks, the date of the first publication to be not less than fourteen days prior to the date set for said election.

Further orders are reserved until the returns of said election are made by the duly authorized election officials and received by this court.

ORDER FOR ELECTION

THE STATE OF TEXAS

COUNTY OF SABINE I There came on to be considered the petition of FIFTY-FIVE freeholders and qualified voters of the hereinafter described subdivision of Sabine County, Texas, praying that an election be ordered in said subdivision to determine whether or not the following classes of animals, to-wit: Horses, mules, jacks, jennets, donkeys, hogs, sheep and goats shall be permitted to run at large within said subdivision, the said subdivision being described by metes and bounds as follows:

BEGINNING at the point where the Sabine and Jasper County Line crosses the south boundary line of the Donald McDonald League; thence westerly with said county line to the intersection of the Sabine, Jasper and San Augustine Counties lines; thence in a northerly direction with and following the meanders of the County line between Sabine County and San Augustine County to the South line of the Benjamin Lindsey League; thence S 75 E with the south line of the Benjamin Lindsey League and the south line of the Larkin Groce League to the Center of U. S. Highway No. 96; thence southerly with the center line of said U. S. Highway No. 96 to the point where said highway crosses Popano Creek, being the first creek on said highway south of the Larkin Groce south league line; thence up Popano Creek with its meanders to the south line of the G. W. Nerren original 125 acre tract on the A. E. C. Johnson and Samuel Surveys; thence East with the South line of said G. W. Nerren original 125 acre tract to the west or northwest line of the Samuel Nelson Survey; thence N 41 E with the Nelson northwest line and the James McKim northwest line to the north corner of the James McKim league in the south or southwest line of the J. A. Curry League; thence S 49 E with the south or southwest line of the J. A. Curry League and the north or northeats line of the James McKim League to the

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northeast line of the James McKim League to the East corner of the James McKim League; thence S 41 W with the East or southeast line of the James McKim league to the Sabine and Newton County line; thence westerly with the Sabine and Newton County line to the intersection of the Jasper and Newton County Line with the Sabine and Newton County line; thence westerly with the Sabine and Jasper County line to the place of beginning; and

It appearing to the satisfaction of the Court that the petition is signed by more than twenty of the freeholders and qualified voters of said subdivision, and is otherwise in conformity with law; and

It further appearing to the court that said election as prayed for should be ordered by this court:

THEREFORE, BE IT ORDERED BY THE COMMISSIONERS' COURT OF SABINE COUNTY, TEXAS: "That an election be held within the above described subdivision on the lOth day of December, A. D. 1955, which date is not less than thirty days from the date of this order, at which election, in accordance with said petition, the following proposition shall be submitted to the freeholders and qualified voters of said subdivision for their action thereupon:

## PROPOSITION

"To determine whether or not the following classes of animals to-wit: Horse, mules, Jacks, jennets, donkeys, hogs, sheep and goats shall be permitted to run at large in said subdivision."

That said election shall be held at the Brookeland High School gymnasium witin said subdivision, and the following named persons are hereby appointed presiding judges for said election: S. C. Mays IS HEREBY APPOINTED PRESIDING Judge and he shall secure the necessary judges and clerks to assist him in holding said election.

The ballot of said election shall have written or printed thereon the following: "FOR LETTING HORSES, MULES, JACKS, JENNETS, DONKEY, HOGS, SHEEP AND GOATS RUN AT LARGE"

"AGAINST LETTING HORSE, MULES, JACKS, JENNETS, DONKEY, HOGS, SHEEP AND GOATS RUN AT LARGE"

Each voter shall scratch or mark out one statement so that the one remaining shall indicate the way he wishes to vote, as provided by the provisions of S. B. No. 294, of the 54th Legislature of T\_xes.

The manner of holding said election shall be governed as near as may be by the Election Code of this State, and none but freeholders and qualified voters within said subdivision shall be allowed to vote at said election.

On or before the tenth day after said election, the officers holding said election shall make returns thereof to the County Judge and return the ballot boxes and supplies pertaining to said election as approved by the Election Code of this State.

Notice of said election shall be given as provided by the laws of the State of Texas.
