The Honorable Commissioner's Court of Sabine County, Texas, met in regular session on June 9, 1958, in the office of the County Judge, Hemphill, with all members of the Court present, to-wit: W. G.Brewton, County Judge, H. W. Wright, Commissioner, Prect. #1, W. T. Love, Commr. Prect. #2, Paul Lout, Commr. Prect. #3, Earl Smith, Commr. Prect. #4, and Kyle D. Walker, Clerk of the Court.

Accounts were allowed as are shown by the Minutes of Accounts Allowed.

It is the Order of the Commissioners Court that the Clerk issue Time Warrants in the amount of \$2100.00 in payment of the difference between the price of one Plymouth car and a new Chevrolet car and the expense of equiping the new car. These warrants payable Feb. 15th, 1959.

Before adjourning the Court Convened as a Board of  $E_{\gamma}$ ualization with all Commissioners and the County Judge subscribing to the following oath:

, a member of the board of equalization of Sabine County, for the year "I, \_\_\_ A. D. 1958, hereby solemnly swear that, in the performance of my duties as a member of such board for said year, I will not vote to allow any taxable property to stand assessed on the tax 

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rolls of said county for said year at any sum which I believe to be less than its true market value, or, if it has no market value, then its real value; that I will faithfully endeavor and as a member of said board will move to have each item of taxable property which I believe to be assessed for said year at lessthan its true market value, or real value, raised on the tax rolls to what I believe to be itstrue cash market value, if it has a market value, and if not, then to its real velue; and that I will faithfully endeavor to have the assessed valuation of all property subject to taxation within said county stand upon the tax rolls of said county for said year at its true cash market value, or, if it has no market value, then its real value. I further solemnly swear that I have read and understand the provisions contained in the Constitution and laws of this State relative to the valuation of taxable property, and that I will faithfully perform all the duties required of me under the Constitution and laws of this State. So help me God."

The Court Adjourned, as a Board of Equalization, on June 9, 1958.
