(2). Issue an order for another and separate election to be held on the same day in each said three (3) School Districts for the purpose of anabling the legally qualified tax-paying voters of each said School District to pass upon said propositions and determine Whether or not the West Sabine County Consolidated Independent School District shall assume and pay off the outstanding bonds of said three (3) School Districts and levy a tax therefor on all the taxable property in said consolidated school District, and in such order set a time and place for the holding of said election and name an election judge and two clerks or helpers to conduct said election, and timethis election be held on the same day said election for consolidation is held, and order that ali other things, such as notice of such election, required by law.
