W. Wright, Commissioner, Precinct #1, W. T. Love, Commissioner, Precinct #2, Paul Lout, Commissioner, Precinct #3, Earl Smith, Commissioner, Precinct #4 and Kyle D. Walker, Clerk of the Court.

Upon a motion by Paul Lout, seconded by W. T. Love, the County Commissioner's Court unanimously voted Aye that the Texas Telephone and Telegraph Company be granted permission to lay their lines in the road beds of the County roads in Sabine County. If in the future these wires would have to be moved for any reason whatsoever, none of the expense of the removal would devolve on Sabine County. Further provided that no responsibility will accrue against Sabine County by reason of permission herein granted.

TO THE HONORABLE COMMISSIONERS' COURT OF SABINE COUNTY:

We, the undersigned, constituting more than twenty freeholders of the hereinafter described territory or subdivision lying wholly within Sabine County, Texas, do hereby petition your Honorable Body to order an election to be held within the hereinafter described subdivision or territory for the purpose of enabling the resident freeholders within said subdivision to determine whether horses, mules, jacks, jennets, donkeys, hogs, sheep and goats shall be permitted to run at large within said subdivision or territory, which said subdivision or territory is more particularly described by metes and bounds as follows:

BEGINNING at the Northeast corner of the James G. Barker 45 $\frac{1}{2}$  acre Survey, Abst. No. 487 on the West bank of Sabine River; THENCE with the North line of said Survey and the North line of the James Gaines League N 80-3/4 W to the Northwest corner of the James Gaines League; THENCE S 9 W with the West line of the James Gaines League to the Southwest corner of said James Gaines League; THENCE S 80-3/4 E with the South line of said James Gaines League to the Northwest corner of the John Taylor Survey; THENCE S 9 $\frac{1}{2}$ W with the West line of the John Taylor Survey to the Southwest corner of said Survey at the Northwest corner of the Nathaniel Hamilton Survey, Abst. No. 119; THENCE South with the West line of said Hamilton Survey to its Southwest corner and continuing said course South to a point on the North line of the Moses Hill League; THENCE West with the North line of the Moses Hill League to the Northwest corner of said League; THENCE South with the West line of said Moses Hill League to the Southwest corner of said Moses Hill League being also an internal corner of the M. ORDER AND NOTICE OF ELECTION

THE STATE OF TEXAS ]

WHEREAS, on the 22nd day of May, 1961, there was presented to the Commissioners' Court of Sabine County, Texas, the petition of W. A. Norsworthy and more than twenty other freeholders and qualified voters of the hereinafter described subdivision of Sabine County requesting that an election be ordered in said subdivision to determine whether or not the following classes of animals, to-wit: Horses, mules, jacks, jennets, donkeys, hogs, sheep and goats shall be permitted to run at large in said subdivision; and

WHEREAS, on the 22nd day of May, 1961, the Commissioners' Court of said County ordered that said election be held in said subdivision on the 26 day of June, 1961, which subdivision is described as follows:

BEGINNING at the Northeast corner of the James G. Varker 45 $\frac{1}{2}$  acre Survey, Abst. No. 487 on the West bank of Sabine River; THENCE with the North line of said Survey and the North line of the James Gaines League N 80-3/4 to the Northwest corner of the James Gaines League; THENCE S 9 W with the West line of the James Gaines League to the Southwest corner of said James Gaines League; THENCE S 80-5/4 E with the South line of said James Gaines League to the Northwest corner of the John Taylor Survey; THENCE S 9 $\frac{1}{2}$  W with the West line of the John Taylor Survey to the Southwest corner of said Survey at the Northwest corner of the Nathaniel Hamilton Survey, Abst. No. 119; THENCE South with the West line of said Hamilton Survey to its Southwest corner and continuing said course South to a point on the North line of the Moses Hill League; THENCE West with the North line of the Moses Hill League to the Northwest corner of said League; THENCE South with the West line of said Moses Hill League to the Southwest corner of said Moses Hill League being also an internal corner of the M. D. White Survey; THENCE East with Moses Hill's South line to the Pologoch Creek; THENCE up said Pologoch Creek with its meanders to the East right-of-way line of State Highway No. 87; THENCE with the East right-of-way line of said State Highway No. 87 in a Southerly direction to the North line of the Joseph Walker 3/4 League; THENCE North 75 East with the North line of said 3/4 League to the Northeast

corner of said Joseph Walker 3/4 League and the Northwest corner of the G. A. Hart Survey; THENCE S 15 E with the East line of said Joseph Walker 3/4 League to the Southwest corner of the Albert Brister Survey; THENCE East with the South line of the Albert Brister Survey and the South line of the Samuel Adams Survey to the Northwest corner of the East one-half of T & NO RR Co., Section 16, Abst. No. 443; THENCE South with the West line of said East half of said Section 16 to the Southwest corner of said Sec. 16 on the North line of the Henry Nichols Lge. and on the North line of a 400 acre subdivision of said League; THENCE East with the North line of said Nichols League to its Northeast corner, being an internal corner of T & NO RR Co., Sec. No. 12, Abst No. 381; THENCE with the East line of said Henry Nichols League S 20 E and with the West line of said Sec. No. 12 and the West line of the O.P. Bourland Survey, Abst. No. 1, to the Southwest corner of said O. P. Bourland Survey; THENCE N 62 1/2 E with the South line of said O. P. Bourland Survey 2678 vrs to the Southeast corner of said O. P. Bourland Survey; THENCE N 22 1/2 W with the East line of the O. P. Bourland Survey 268 vrs. to the Southwest corner of the W. L. Smith Survey, Abst No. 348; THENCE North 70 E with the South line of the W. L. Smith Survey and the South line of the J. R. Peddy Survey, Abst. No. 344, to an internal corner of said J. R. Peddy Survey; THENCE S 26 E with Peddy's lower West line to the Northwest corner of the G. L. Bourland Survey, Abst. No. 2, in the East line of the Jesse Low Survey, Abst. No. 147; THENCE N 70 E with the North line of the G. L. Bourland Survey to the Northeast corner of said survey and continuing the same course to the West bank of Sabine River; THENCE up and with the meanders of the Sabine River and following the West bank of same to the PLACE OF BEGINNING.

WHEREAS, Article 6934 of the Revised Civil Statutes of the State of Texas also requires that the County Judge shall issue an order for said election;

NOW, THEREFORE, I, O. A. Beauchamp, in my capacity as County Judge of Sabine County, Texas, do hereby order that an election be held in said subdivision on the 26 day of June, 1961, which date is not less than 30 days from the date of this order, at which election, in accordance with said petition, the following proposition shall be submitted to the freeholders and qualified voters of said subdivision for their action thereupon:

PROPOSITION

To determine whether or not the following classes of animals, to-wit: Horses, mules, jacks, jennets, donkeys, hogs, sheep and goats shall be permitted to run at large in said subdivision:

That said election shall be held at the following places in said subdivision and the following named persons are hereby appointed Presiding Judges for said election.

At Election Precinct No. 18, in Low's Chapel Church Building in said Precinct No. 18 in Sabine County, Texas, with Mrs. Tholma Cavender as Presiding Judge.

The ballots of said election shall have written or printed thereon the following:  
 "FOR LETTING HORSES, MULES, JACKS, JENNETS, DONKEYS, HOGS, SHEEP AND GOATS RUN AT LARGE"  
 "AGAINST LETTING HORSES, MULES, JACKS, JENNETS, DONKEYS, HOGS, SHEEP AND GOATS RUN AT LARGE"

Each voter shall mark out with black ink or black pencil one of the above expressions, thus leaving the other as indicating his vote, as provided by the Election Code of the State of Texas.

The manner of holding said election shall be governed as near as may be by the Election Code of this state, and none but freeholders and qualified voters of said subdivision shall be allowed to vote at said election.

On or before the tenth day after said election, the officers holding said election

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shall make returns thereof to the County Judge and return the ballot boxes and supplies pertaining to said election as provided by the Election Code of this State.

A Copy of this order shall serve as notice of said election, and said notice shall be published in a newspaper of general circulation published in this County, the date of the first publication being at least 30 days before the date of said election and continue in each successive issue of said newspaper up to the date of the election.

BEGINNING at a point in the W. B. line of the Joseph Walker 3/4 League Survey, where the centerline of Farm Road No. 85 crosses said line; THENCE in a Southwesterly direction with and following the centerline of said Farm Road 85 to the point where the centerline of said Farm Road 85 crosses the W. B. line of the James Low Survey, Abst No. 341; THENCE S 5 E with West line of said James Low Survey to the West line of the John Moore League, Abst. No. 41; THENCE N. 35 E with Moore's West line to the Northwest corner of said League; THENCE S 55 E with Moore's North line to the Northeast corner of said League; THENCE S 35 W with the East line of said John Moore League to the centerline of Farm Road 2426, leading from Pineland to Yellowpine; THENCE Easterly with the centerline of said Farm Road 2426 to its intersection with the centerline of State Highway No. 87; THENCE Northerly with the centerline of State Highway No. 87 to the point where said centerline crosses the E. Quinalty Survey; THENCE S 32 W with Davis' and Quinalty's line to the SE corner of the W. H.
