TO THE HONORABLE COMMISSIONERS' COURT OF SABINE COUNTY, TEXAS:

WE, THE UNDERSIGNED, being duly qualified voters of Sabine County, Texas, and constituting in numbers more than TEN (10) PER CENT of the number voting for Governor at the last preceding general election in said County of Sabine, State of Texas, do hereby respectfully petition The Honorable Commissioners' Court of Sabine County, Texas, to order an election to be held within and throughout Sabine County, Texas, for the purpose of submitting to the qualified voters of Sabine County, Texas, the proposition of whether a majority of the qualified voters of said Sabine County, Texas, desire to adopt the provisions of ARTICLE 6716-1, Section 1 through Section 16, Vernon's Annotated Civil Statutes of The State of Texas, for the construction and maintenance of county roads and bridges and for the expenditure of the County Road and Bridge Fund, the aforesaid Article and its referred to Sections being known as "THE OPTIONAL COUNTY ROAD LAW OF 1947."

The law applicable hereto provides, among other provisions, that upon presentation of this petition, in due form and content, this Honorable Commissioners' Court shall submit such question to the qualified voters of Sabine County, Texas at a general or special election to be held not less than thirty (30) days nor more than sixty (60) days after this petition is filed with this Honorable Commissioners' Court; providing further, that the ballot for such election shall read:

"For the Optional County Road Law of 1947"; or

"Against the Optional County Road Law of 1947."

and if there be a favoring vote at such election, the provisions of such Act shall become effective with the official proclamation of the results of such election.

The date of Dec. 21, 1963, being the date set on which said election shall be held, is not less than (30) thirty days nor more than (60) sixty days from this the 12th day of Nov., 1963.

The polls shall be open between the usual hours of 8:00 A. M. and 7:00 P. M. on said date for such election at all of the voting places in all of the precincts of election of Sabine County, Texas, and the election judge for each numbered voting precinct within and throughout the County of Sabine, Texas, shall be those persons who have heretofore been appointed for the holding of the General Election.

No person shall vote at such election unless he is a qualified voter under the Constitution and the laws of the State of Texas. All votes of such election shall be by ballot, and the ballot for such election shall read:

"FOR THE OPTIONAL COUNTY ROAD LAW OF 1947"

OR

"AGAINST THE OPTIONAL COUNTY ROAD LAW OF 1947"

Within the time prescribed by law, after all votes have been counted and tabulated the persons holding such election shall make due returns of all the votes cast in their respective voting places for and against said proposition to the person and/or official authorized by law to receive such returns.
