

The Honorable Commissioner's Court met in regular session at the regular meeting place May 11, 1964 with the following members present: O. A. Beauchamp, County Judge, H. W. Wright, Commissioner, Precinct No. 1, W. T. Love, Commissioner, Precinct No. 2, Paul Lout, Commissioner, Precinct No. 3, Earl Smith, Commissioner, Precinct No. 4, and Kyle D. Walker, Clerk of the Court.

Motion was made by Paul Lout and seconded by Earl Smith that the Sabine County Commissioners' Court accept the provisions contained in Minute Order No. 54480 passed by the State Highway Commission on May 6, 1964, for the improvement by the Texas Highway Department of the roads described below and that Sabine County agrees to furnish all required right-of-way free of cost to the State: Extending from end of F. M. Road 2866 South to San Augustine County Line, a distance of approximately 3.0 miles.

Vote on the motion was as follows: Unanimous for approval. Whereupon the motion was declared carried.

Motion was made by Paul Lout, seconded by Earl Smith it was unanimously ordered that the Commissioners' Court of Sabine County, make application to the State Department of Public Welfare for food commodities donated by the U. S. Department of Agriculture.

It was further ordered that Lois Smith be appointed authorized Representative and is

hereby given full responsibility and authority for all matters pertinent to the receipt, storage, and use of such food commodities, and the maintenance of all such records.

The following conditions for eligibility to receive Commodities by individuals or families were adopted by the Commissioners' Court:

All eligible applicants must be a Citizen of the United States and must have been a resident of the State of Texas for at least one year, and of the County of Sabine for at least six months immediately preceding the date of application. Commodities will be issued only to those individuals or families having facilities for preparing and serving meals.

The level of income and resources from all sources to be followed in determining eligibility to receive commodities shall be as follows:

No. of Persons:	1	2	3	4-5	6-7	8-9	10 or more add
Income per month:	\$83.00	\$135.00	\$150.00	\$165.00	\$180.00	\$195.00	\$7.50 for each Add. person.

The resource maximums set may be lower than those specified below, but no city or county plan will be approved which includes in the Standard of Eligibility resource maximums above the following figures:

One Person - \$300.00

Two Persons \$450.00

Add \$50.00 for each additional person up to \$600.00..

Recipients of Old Age, Aid to the Blind, Aid to Dependent children, Aid to the Permanently and Totally Disabled and their normal dependents are hereby declared to be eligible, on a blanket basis, to receive commodities, provided the other above conditions are met on an individual case basis. The term "Normal Dependents" may consist of an eligible spouse, minor children or mentally or physically incapacitated adult children living with and dependent on the head of the household.

Accounts were allowed and payable as shown in Minutes of Accounts Allowed.

There being no further business, the Court adjourned.
