



for construction or maintenance thereof.

II.

SABINE RIVER AUTHORITY OF TEXAS would show that the only roads not completed as specified in the said contract dated March 27, 1967, between SABINE RIVER AUTHORITY OF TEXAS and the County of Sabine are certain roads designated C-16 and C-16A which are more particularly described in said contract. In meeting its legal obligations with respect to said roads, the Authority would be required and has made plans to construct gravel roads thereby providing a restoration of access of like kind and quality as existed previously. As to the C-16A road, all equipment and materials necessary to accomplish such construction has been scheduled and procured by the Authority and is assured of completion prior to January 1, 1968, subject only to inclement weather. It has now been proposed that the C-16 road be upgraded in accordance with a proposal dated November 11, 1968, submitted to Sabine County, Texas, which provides for the construction of a permanent road with 6 inch by 20 ft. compacted base sealed with prime coat of emulsified asphalt upon maximum density and curing with a surfacing consisting of single course 3/8 inch Slurry Seal 18 foot wide containing 18 pounds crushed limestone, 1/3 -1/2 gallon THD SSK-h asphalt, per square yard rolled pneumatically for total compaction.

III.

SABINE RIVER AUTHORITY OF TEXAS would show that it is willing if the County of Sabine will undertake the construction of C-16 on an upgraded basis as specified in paragraph II above to contribute a reasonable and fair share of the cost thereof in lieu of and in substitution for the accomplishment of its obligations under the contract heretofore entered with the County of Sabine and referred to hereinabove, provided, however, that such contribution shall in no instance exceed a total sum of TWENTY-TWO THOUSAND AND NO/100 DOLLARS (\$22,000.00) and shall be payable upon completion of the work in substantial accordance with the specifications hereinabove set forth.

IV.

SABINE RIVER AUTHORITY OF TEXAS does further offer in the event the County of Sabine is willing to undertake the construction of C-16 as hereinabove proposed to provide one maintainer and operator and one water truck and driver to assist in the construction of the said C-16, provided, however, that the County of Sabine in like manner provides equivalent equipment and personnel to aid in the construction of such road.

WHEREFORE, premises considered, SABINE RIVER AUTHORITY OF TEXAS respectfully requests that the Commissioners' Court of Sabine County, Texas, accept the roads specified in paragraph I hereof as complete, and release SABINE RIVER AUTHORITY OF TEXAS from any further liability with respect thereto. Further, SABINE RIVER AUTHORITY OF TEXAS requests that the Commissioners' Court by order specify its agreement to the proposed substitution of the program of work heretofore planned and agreed to be accomplished by SABINE RIVER AUTHORITY OF TEXAS with respect to the said C-16 road for its proposal to participate in the reasonable cost and expenses attendant to construction of an upgraded and improved road in accordance with the proposals hereinabove set forth.

{ORDERS ACCEPTING CERTAIN ROADS FOR COUNTY MAINTENANCE} ACKNOWLEDGING CONTRACTUAL COMPLIANCE WITH RESPECT THERETO AND PROVIDING FOR SUBSTITUTION OF OBLIGATION TO UPGRADE QUALITY

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This the 26th day of November, 1968, came to be heard by the Commissioners' Court of Sabine County, Texas, a petition by SABINE RIVER AUTHORITY OF TEXAS for the acceptance of certain roads which the said SABINE RIVER AUTHORITY OF TEXAS had cause to be constructed and altered in accordance with its contractual agreement with the County of Sabine dated March 27, 1967, occasioned by and as a result of the need for certain alterations due to the construction of Toledo Bend Dam and Reservoir Project which petition further contained a proposal by the SABINE RIVER AUTHORITY OF TEXAS for contribution of funds in substitution for completion of work on a certain road known as C-16 in order that the County of Sabine could proceed with the construction of such road in accordance with upgraded standards, all of which is more fully set forth in said petition to which reference is made; and the Court having fully considered said petition and all matters relating thereto at regular meeting at which all interested parties in attendance were heard by the Court; and the Court having fully considered the matters and reached decisions with respect to certain facts relating thereto and having made the following findings, to-wit:

1. That SABINE RIVER AUTHORITY OF TEXAS has complied with or made adequate provision for meeting its obligations to the County of Sabine with respect to construction and alteration of certain roads described in said contract as follows: C-7A, C-8A, C-18, C-18A, C-19, C-19A, C-20B, C-20C, C-20D, C-12B and C-16A and that by the construction thereof such roads provide reasonable restoration of access to the areas formerly served by such roads as were inundated and abandoned by reason of the construction of Toledo Bend Dam and Reservoir Project.

2. That it is in the interest of the public to improve the quality of that certain section of roadway designated as C-16 in that certain contract by and between the County of Sabine and SABINE RIVER AUTHORITY OF TEXAS dated March 27, 1967, in accordance with the proposal of SABINE RIVER AUTHORITY OF TEXAS set forth in its petition to this Court.

The Court having considered all other matters respecting the foregoing findings does hereby make the following orders and direct the same be spread upon the official minutes of the Commissioners' Court of Sabine County, Texas, to-wit:

ORDER NO. 1

That the SABINE RIVER AUTHORITY OF TEXAS be released from any further obligations or liability with respect to construction or maintenance of certain roads fully described in a contract between the SABINE RIVER AUTHORITY OF TEXAS and the County of Sabine dated March 27, 1967, and that the County of Sabine now and hereafter be responsible for operation and maintenance of said roadways.

ORDER NO. 2

That SABINE RIVER AUTHORITY OF TEXAS in lieu of its obligations with respect to that certain roadway designated C-16 in said contract dated March 27, 1967, contribute its fair share of the reasonable costs of constructing said C-16 in accordance with the proposal of SABINE RIVER AUTHORITY OF TEXAS not to exceed a total contribution of TWENTY-TWO THOUSAND AND NO/100 DOLLARS (\$22,000.00) and provided further that SABINE RIVER AUTHORITY OF TEXAS provide equipment and personnel as set forth in said proposal.

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ORDER NO. 3

That the County Judge be authorized to act for and on behalf of this Court in advising SABINE RIVER AUTHORITY OF TEXAS of the acceptance of roadways specified in Order No. 1 and in evidencing the intention of the Court to modify that certain contract and agreement as intended by Order No. 2 above.
