On this the 23rd day of June, 1969, the Honorable Commissioners' Court met in regular session with the following members present, to-wit:

Motion was made by Paul Lout, seconded by T. A. Seales, it was unanimously ordered that the Commissioners' Court of Sabine County make application to the State Department of Public Welfare for food commodities donated by the U. S. Department of Agriculture.

It was further ordered that Lois Smith be appointed authorized Representative and

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hereby given full responsibility and authority for all matters pertinent to the receipt storage, and use of such food commodities, and the maintenance of all such records.

The following conditions for eligibility to receive Commodities by individuals or families were adopted by the Commissioners' Court:

1. U. S. Citizenship (will) (#####) be required.
2. Residence in the County for a period of 6 months (will) (#####) be required.
3. Residence in the State for a period of 12 months (will) (#####) be required.
4. Applicants (###) (will not) be required to show that they are unemployed due to a mental or physical handicap of a permanent or temporary nature.
5. Net income to an individual or household in excess of the amount shown in the table below will render an applicant ineligible.

6. Resources in excess of the amounts shown below will render the individual or household ineligible.
1 Person \$300.00 2 Persons \$450.00 Add \$7.50 for each additional person up to \$500.00.
7. In establishing the value of resources, the following items will not be considered:
Homesteads Essential Transportation
Household Goods Tools of Trade
Loan Value of Insurance up to \$1,000.00 per person; Live stock necessary for Home produced food; All other capital resources will be considered.
8. Public assistance households as defined, receiving assistance through the Texas State Department of Public Welfare (will) (#####) be required to meet the requirements specified for items 1 through 7 above to be eligible for referral to receive donated commodities.


The above standard of Eligibility is to be used for the year beginning September 1, 1969 and ending August 31, 1970 unless or until some change is proposed and approved in writing. Recipients of Old Age, Aid to the Blind, Aid to Dependent children, Aid to the Permanently and Totally Disabled and their normal dependents are hereby declared to be eligible, on a blanket basis, to receive commodities, provided the other above conditions are met on an individual cases basis. The term "Normal Dependents" may consist of an eligible spouse, minor children or mentally or physically incapacitated adult children living with and dependent on the head of the household.

Lewis Whitacre, U. S. Forest Service, appeared before the Court to discuss R.O.W. on roads G-18, G-18A, and G-19 and to make arrangements through Toledo Bend Dam Authorities for completion of these roads in order that they would be acceptable to Sabine County.

The Commissioners' Court agreed to meet as the County Board of Equalization at 9:00 A. M. Wednesday, June 25, 1969.

All accounts were allowed and made payable.

There being no further business, the Court adjourned.
