## ORDER OF COMMISSIONERS COURT

On this the 25th day of August, 1969, the Commissioners' Court of Sabine County, Texas meeting in a regular session with a quorum present, considered the request of Billy T. Davidson, that the County of S bine accept as a dedicated public road the following described road: A graded road formerly known as the Hickory Hill School House wad leading west from a point on Highway 87, north of Polo Goucho Creek in the Isaac Caradine Survey, abstract 82, and being the first graded road a short distance north of where the United Gas Pippline crosses Highway 87, said road continuing in a westerly direction to the D. K. Davidson Estate.

It appears to the Commissioners' Court that said road has been maintained by the County as a public road up to the D. K. Davidson home place and it further appearing to the Court that the acceptance and dedlaration of the above described road leading to the D. K. Davidson home place as a public county road would be to the best interest of the public, on motion by Paul Lout duly seconded by F. A. Seales the following order was adopted by the Commissioners! Court of Sabine County, Texas by the following vote: Voting yes '4 Voting No.

The above described roadway leading from Highway 87 in a westerly direction to the D. K. Davidson home place is hereby accepted as and declared to be a public road and used as a public road from henceforth. ATTEST:

## ORDER OF COMMISSIONERS COURT OF SABINE COUNTY, TEXAS

WHEREAS after careful study and condideration of the voting precincts of Sabine County, Texas, it appears to the Court that it would benefit the people of the county as a whole and that they sewould be a saving in election expenses to make the changes om the voting precincts as hereinafter set forth;

WHEREAS the population shifts and changes in certain areas of the county have made the hereinafter changes in the voting precincts desirable;

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WHEREAS, the Sabine County Democratic Executive Committee has requested that the hereinafter changes in the voting precincts be made;

Upon a motion being made by Paul Lout and seconded by T. A. Seales, the following order was passed by the following vote of:

It is hereby ORDERED by the Commissioners Court of Sabine County, Texas, sitting in regular session on this 25th day of August, 1969, and acting under the authority of Article 2.04 of the Texas Election Code, that the voting precincts of Sabine County Texas be changed and modified as follows:

Voting Precinct No. 12, being Fairmount voting precinct shall be combined and made a part of the Yellowpine Voting Precinct No. 7, and voting Precinct No. 7, being Yellowpine voting precinct shall henceforth be described as follows:

BEGINNING at the Southeast corner of Sabine County where the South line of said count intersects the Sabine River or Toledo Bend Reservoir;

THENCE Westerly along the South line of Sabine County, being the Sabine-Newton County line to the intersection of said county line with the West line of the Alex Gilmer Survey, A-441;

THENCE Northerly along the West line of the Gilmer Survey, to the Southwest corner of the JOHN GALLION Survey, A-17;

THENCE Northerly along the West line of the JOHN GALLION Survey to its North-west corner;

THENCE Easterly along the North line of said GALLION Survey to the Southwest corner of the T & NO Ry Co. Survey, A-418;

THENCE Northerly a ong the T & NO RY. CO. Survey's West line to the Scrapping Valley Road;

THENCE Northerly along said road to Six Mile Creek;

THENCE Westerly and up Six Mile Creek to the West line of the Walter Hughes Survey, A-24;

THENCE Northerly along the W line of said Hughes Survey to the NW corner of the Same and the most Southerly corner of the T. F. Gilbert Survey, A-337;

THENCE Northwesterly along the SW line of said Gilbert Survey to its most Westerly corner;

THENCE N along its West line past its NW corner and continuing on the same course to an interior corner of the M.A. Lowe Survey, A-275;

THENCE Northwesterly to the SW corner of the H. T. & C. Ry. Co. Survey A-44679

THENCE Northeasterly along the W line of said H. T. & C. Ry. Co. Survey to the S. line of the William W. Davis Survey, A-89;

THENCE Northwesterly along its SW line to its SW corner;

THENCE Northeasterly along its W line to its most Northerly corner;

THENCE Southeasterly along the N line of said Davis Survey to the SE corner of the Sion Smith Survey, A-55;

THENCE Northeasterly along the Smith E line to the SW corner of the John Haley Survey;

THENCE EAsterly along the Haley Survey S line to its SE corner;

THENCE Northerly along the E line of said Haley Survey to Housen Bayou;

THENCE Easterly and down said Bayou to the E line of the Henry Nichols Survey A-46;

THENCE Northerly along the Nichols E line to the NW corner of the Jesse Low Survey,  $A-l\downarrow 7$ ;

THENCE Easterly along the N line of said Low Survey to its NE corner;

THENCE Southerly along the Jesse Low East line to the NW corner of the G. L. Bourland League;

THENCE Easterly along the N line of said Bourland Survey to the NE corner of the same;

THENCE Southerly along iss E line to the Sabine River or Toledo Bend Reservoir; THENCE Southerly and down said Sabine River or Toledo Bend Reservoir, to the Plact OF BEGINNING:

All qualified voters living within the area formerly known as Faarmount Voting Precinct No. 12, shall, beginning 1-1-70, the beginning of the next election year, vote as a part of Yellowpine Voting Precinct No. 7 at the duly selected polling place of said Voting Precinct No. 7.

Voting Precinct No. 18, being Lowe's Chapel Voting Precinct shall be combined with and made a part of the Milam Voting Precinct No. 4 and Voting Precinct No. 4, being Milam Voting Precinct shall henceforth be described as follows:

BEGINNING at a point where <u>Rellogaucho</u> Creek enters the Sabine River or Tolĝdo Bend Reservoir;

THENCE Northerly with the meanders of said Sabine River to a point where it intersects Patroon Creek;

THENCE Northerly with said Patroon Creek to the NBL of the James Gaines League, A-16; THENCE Westerly along said James Gaines N. line to the NWC of said James Gaines League;

THENCE Southerly along the James Gaines League West line to the NEC of the W. B. Frazier Survey, A-101;

THENCE Westerly along the NBL of said Frazier Survey and the NBL of the J. S. Chiveral Survey, A-186 to the NEC of the Isaac Powell Survey, A-48;

THENCE Westerly along the North line of said Powell Survey to its most Northerly NWC;

THENCE Southerly along the most Easterly West Boundary line of said Powell Survey to an interior corner of said survey;

THENCE Westerly along the most Southerly North line of said Powell Survey to a point in the EBL of the W. H. Cooper Survey, A-229;

THENCE Southerly along the Cooper Survey East Boundary Line to the North East Corner of the A. H. McGown Survey;

THENCE Westerly and Southerly along the NBL and WBL of said Cooper Survey to the most Easterly NE corner of the William Pace Survey, A-177;

THENCE North West and North East along Pace's North line to the South line of the David Huffman Survey, A-23;

THENCE West and South West and West and South  $W_{\rm e}$ st to the East line of the N. Mackey, A-38;

THENCE South along the East line of the Mackey Survey to its South East corner;

THENCE Westerly along the South line of the Mackey Survey to where the North line of the Errington Survey intersects the said South line of the said Mackey Survey;

THENCE South East along the North ling of the Errington Survey to its North East corner;

THENCE South West to its West line;

THENCE North West to the said Errington North West corner;
