It is the desire and intention of each of the undersigned landowners to dedicate for public road purposes all real estate lying within the above designated right-of-way; however, the said undergigned land owners respectibely reserve and except to themselves, their heirs, and assigns all oil, gas, and sulphur in and under their respective parcels of land herein dedicated for such right-of-way, but waive all right of ingress and egress, thereon for the purposes of exploring, developing, mining, or deilling for the same.

The grantor hereinexpressly cretains the right to cur and remove any and all timber that he may desire to take foom the right-of-way herein described, at any time prior to the time actual construction work is begun on the said hǵghway.

The grantor relinquishes all claims to timber left on said right-of-way at the time construction work is started and to timber that may grow on said right-of-way.

It is specifically understood that the state and its assigns shall be bested with the title to and the right to take and use, without additional compensation any stone, earth, gravel, caliche, iron ore gravel, or any materials or minerals upon, in and under said land, except oil, gas, and sulphur for the construction and maintenance of the Highway System of Texas.

TO HAVE AND TO HOLD, the above described premises, subject to the reservations above stated, together with all and singular the rights and appurtenances therein anywise belonging to Sebine County, Texas, and its ass igns, and we the undersigned landowners, hereby bind ourselves, our heirs, executors and adminifistrators to warrant and forever defendeg all and singular, the said premises unto Sabine County Texas, and fts assigns against every person whosoever lawfully claiming or to claim the same or any part thereof.
