Richard W. Keyes, Texas Department of Public Safety, Regional Larson Officer, Division of Defense and Disaster Relief appeared before the Court concerning a Civil Defense Unit for Sabine County.

Motion by Commissioner Paul Lout, seconded by Commissioner, R. E. Smith, the Court authorized the County Judge to sign the following:

Under the authority vested in us as the Mayor and County Judge by the Texas Civil Protection Act of 1951, as amended, and Executive Order #2, dated July 19, 1950, We hereby designate the following personnel whose typed names and sample signature appear below, to receive surplus property in the name of this Civil Defense organization and to execute on our behalf any and all agreements, contracts, requisitions, requests, and supporting documents with the Texas Surplus Property Agency, relating to the Civil Defense Surplus Property Program in the County of Sabine. The County Judge was also authorized to sign a document titled "Assurance Of Compliance With The Department Of Defense And Office Of Civil Defense Regulations Under Title VI Of The Civil Rights Act of 1964" and a letter advising that Oscar P. Pate has been appointed Civil Defense Director For Sabine County.

Motion by Commissioner H. E. Wilburn, seconded by Commissioner Paul Lout and by unanimous consent the Court passed an order to continue being compensated on a Salary Basis for 1971 and the Clerk was ordered to forward to the Comptroller of Public Accounts a certified copy of said order.

Motion by Commissioner R. E. Smith, seconded by Commissioner T. A. Seales, the Court authorized U. S. Forest Service to close approximately 200 yards of an old road inside the Moore Plantation.

Motion by Commissioner Paul Lout, seconded by Commissioner, H. E. Wilburn, the Court announced the following holidays for 1971:
