Each member of the Board took the following oath: "I, _____, a member of the Board of Equalization of Sabine County, for the year A. D. 1971, hereby solemnly swear that, in the performance of my duties as member for such board for said year, I will not vote to allow any taxable property to stand assessed on the tax rolls of said county for said year at any sum which I believe to be less than its real value; and that I will faithfully endeavor to have the assessed valuation of all property subject to taxation within said county stand upon the tax rolls of said county for said year at its true cash market value, or if it has no market value, I further, solemnly swear that I have read and understand the provisions contained in the Constitution and laws of this State relative to the valuation of taxable property, and that I will faithfully perform all the duties required of me under the Constitution and laws of this state. So help me God."

This Board of Equalization worked until July 15, 1971.

There being no further business the Board adjourned.
