Motion by Commissioner Paul Lout, seconded by Commissioner R. E. Smith, and all voting in favor, effective this date, Willie Reagan was employed as temporary secretary for Justice of Peace, Precinct No. 1, four days each month at a salary of \$12.00 per day.

County Agent Frank Mears was designated to distribute 5000 lbs. of Myrex (Ant Poison) given to the County by the Texas Department of Agriculture. It was thought that the Myrex should be placed in stores throughout the county for free issue to the public.

Motion by Commissioner H. E. Wilburn, seconded by Commissioner G. W. Russell, Jr., the Court voted unanimously to authorize the County Agent to purchase at a price of \$37.50, steel rods to make 9 steel cages to be used in a survey with Texas A&M College for the control of horse nettles.

Effective March 27, 1973, John McCary was employed to replace Henderson Love, deceased at a salary of \$269.00 per month.

Motion by Commissioner Paul Lout, seconded by Commissioner G. W. Russell, Jr., the Court voted unanimously to designate First State Bank, Hemphill, Texas as the County Depository.

I agree to furnish all labor and materials to finish roof, as following:

Will strip roof with 2 x 4 - 24" OC, sheet entire roof with 4 x 8 x 1/2 yellow pine plywood, cover with 15# felt and 235# composition roof, color selected by owner for the sum of Three Thousand, Six hundred and Eighteen dollars. (\$3,618.00)

Room - Storage Stolen
Goods

I agree to furnish all labor and materials to finish the office and room as following:

1 x 4 - 24" OC vertical
1 x 4 - top and bottom anchored with ramset nails
Panel Walls, allowance-----@ 4.00
Anchored to 1 x 4 striping
Prefinish cove mold around rooms at top of paneling
Prefinish base and shoe at bottom of paneling
Prefinish casing around present windows and doors. Windows, doors and ceilings will be painted.

Room where stolen articles are kept will be finished same as the office, except where the rest room is. There will be a 2 x 4 framed wall, finished same as the office with 2-doors, one to the rest room, the other to storage. Rest room and storage will be left as is. For the sum of One Thousand, Six Hundred and Fifty-three Dollars (\$1,653.00).
