Attorney Macon Strother, Mr. W. D. Shirley, and Mrs. J. B. King appeared before the Court concerning opening an old road which runs through Harbor Light Subdivision to the old Sidney McClanahan place in the Moses Hill Survey, Abstract 117. A hearing on the matter was set for April 23, 1973 at the regular meeting of Commissioners Court.

After hearing a report from Sheriff Blain Greer on the Radio Communication System, motion by Commissioner G. W. Russell, Jr, seconded by R. E. Smith, and with all voting AYE, the Court authorized installing a communication tower on the courthouse at a cost of \$513.00.

RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, The Year Nineteen Hundred and Seventy-Six (1976) will be the two-hundredth (200th) Anniversary of the founding of the United States of America, and

WHEREAS, The citizens of Jasper, Newton, Sabine and San Augustine counties have expressed their desire to promote and participate, jointly in a Regional Bi-Centennial Exposition to commemorate the two-hundredth (200th) anniversary of the founding of this country, and

WHEREAS, The said counties are desirous of obtaining designation from the American Revolution Bi-Centennial Commission as a State Centennial Exposition, and

WHEREAS, The guidelines of the American Revolution Bi-Centennial Commission of Texas require submission of a resolution stating the proposed project and establishing a Bi-Centennial Committee:

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COMMISSIONERS' COURT OF THE COUNTY OF SABINE, TEXAS, THAT:

1. The proposed Bi-Centennial Exposition, described in the attachment entitled "Pineywoods Bi-Centennial Exposition" has been endorsed by this Court as a worth project and is consistent with the county's goals to enhance the quality of living and promote economic and social development within its jurisdiction.
