## LAW ENFORCEMENT OFFICER - INTERLOCAL ASSISTANCE

WHEREAS, The County of Sabine, under the provisions of Article 999b, V. A. C. S., is authorized to make provisions for its regularly employed law enforcement officers to a ssist any other county or municipality when the mayor, or other efficer authorized to declare a state of civil emergency, requests their assistance; and

WHEREAS, Provided that when such request is made by such county or municipality that there exists in such other county or municipality a need for the services of additional law enforcement officers to protect the health, life, and property of such other county or municipality, its inhabitants, and the visitors thereto, by reason of riot, unlawful assembly characterized by the use of force and violence, or threat thereof by three or more persons acting together or without lawful authority, or during time of natural diaster or manmade calamity, the person hereinafter designated may send the regularly employed law enforcement officers of said City/County to their assistance; now, therefore, bé it RESOLVED. That the County of Sabine does hereby appoint and authorized <u>Sheriff</u> of Sabine County, Texas at his discretion to send the regularly employed law enforcement officers to assist any other county or municipality when the mayor, or other officers authorized to declare a state of civil emergency requests this assistance, and there exists in such other county or municipality, its inhabitants, and the visitors thereto, by reason of rict, unlawful assembly characterized by the use of force and violence, or threat thereof by three or more persons acting together or without lawful authority, or during time of natural diaster or man-made clamity.
