Motion by Commissioner R. E. Smith, seconded by Commissioner Paul Lout and by ŀβ unanimous vote, the Court directed the County Treasurer to divide \$6,844.06 received from the Office of Emergency Preparedness according to November 12, 1974, audit report as follows: Road & Bridge Fund No. 3-----\$3,687.06 Road & Bridge Fund No. 4-----\$3,157.00 Motion by Commissioner Jimmy Vickers, seconded by Commissioner R.
