A delegation from Toledo Beech Subdivision met with the Court concerning traffic signs in the subdivision to control speeding in the area. The County Attorney will give an opinion later as to whether or not the County has authority to place traffic signs in this area.

The Sabine County Fire Ant Control Corp. with their chairman, L. T. Halbert, appeared before the Court asking that a referendum be placed on the November General Election Ballot so that the people could vote for or against an issue to levy a tax to assist in the control of fire ants in Sabine County. Motion by Commissioner, G. W. Russell, Jr., seconded by Commissioner Paul Lout and with all voting "Aye", the above matter was turned over to the County Attorney to



see if and how this could be done.

Motion by Commissioner R. E. Smith, seconded by Commissioner G. W. Russell, Jr. and by unanimous vote, the expense account of Deputy Sheriffs J. D. Walker and Lamar Williams was increased \$50.00 per mnnth effective June 1, 1976.

The Court granted a Holiday for Monday, July 5, 1976.

An Order Declaring Results of Local Option Election was issued by the Court and a copy of said Order is attached hereto, marked "Exhibit A" and becomes a part of the minutes of this date.

All accounts were allowed and made payable.

There being no further business, the Court adjourned.

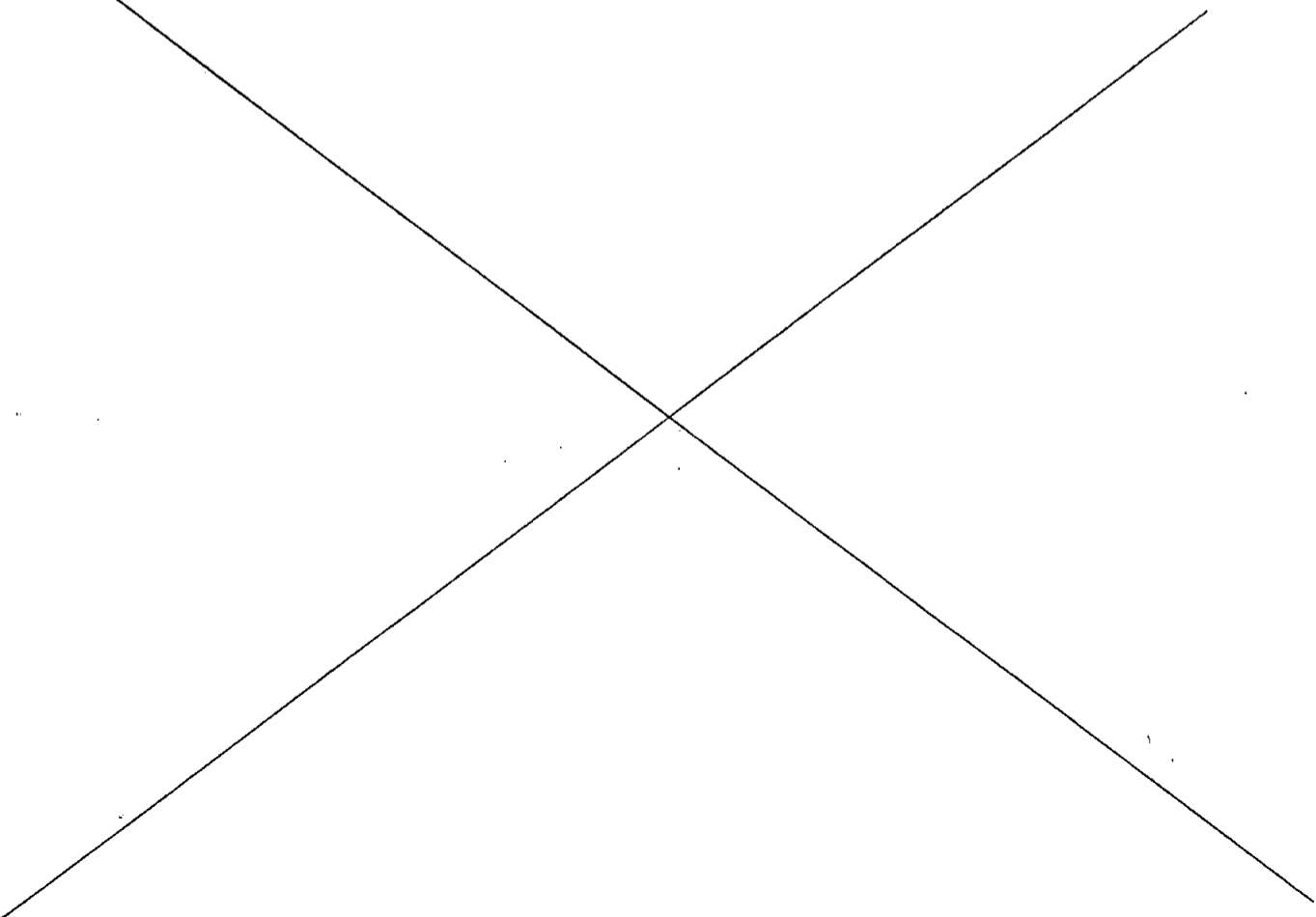

ORDER DECLARING RESULT OF LOCAL OPTION ELECTION

THE STATE OF TEXAS }
COUNTY OF Sabine }

On this the 28th day of June, 1976, the Commissioners' Court of Sabine County, Texas, convened in Regular session open to the public, at the regular meeting place thereof at the Courthouse in Hemphill Texas, with the following members of the Court present, to-wit:

- W. T. Love, County Judge,
- R. E. Smith, Commissioner Precinct No. 1,
- G. W. Russell, Jr., Commissioner Precinct No. 2,
- Paul Lout, Commissioner Precinct No. 3,
- Jimmy Vickers, Commissioner Precinct No. 4,
- W. W. Cavender, County Clerk,

and the following absent: none

constituting a quorum, and among other proceedings, passed the following order:

There came on to be considered the returns of an election held on the 19th day of June, 1976, in Justice Precinct No. 2,
(County, Justice Precinct, Incorporated City or Town)
Texas, to determine whether or not the sale of alcoholic beverages of the type specified in the Order calling said election shall be prohibited or legalized.

It appearing to the satisfaction of the Court that said election was in all respects legally held, and that said returns were duly and legally made, and that there were cast at said election 597 valid and legal votes, of which number there were cast

FOR*the legal sale of beer and wine for off-premise consumption only	<u>213</u> Votes
AGAINST* the legal sale of beer and wine for off-premise consumption only	<u>384</u> Votes

IT IS, THEREFORE, FOUND AND DECLARED AND SO ORDERED by the Commissioners' Court of Sabine County, Texas:

That a majority of the qualified voters in said above named area voting at said election voted to prohibit the sale of alcoholic beverages of the type specified in the order calling said election.
(prohibit or legalize)

*Insert issues as they appear in the order calling the election.
For example: "FOR the legal sale of beer" votes.
"AGAINST the legal sale of beer" votes.

That the sale of alcoholic beverages of the type specified in the order calling said election is absolutely prohibited within the above named area after thirty days from the date of this order and thereafter until such time as the qualified voters therein may thereafter, at a legal election held for such purpose by a majority vote decide otherwise. This order shall be published by posting a copy of same at three public places within the above mentioned area and the County Clerk is hereby directed to cause said notices to be posted as provided by law.*

This order shall be entered of record in the office of the Clerk of this Court, whereupon it shall be lawful in said above mentioned area to manufacture, sell or distribute alcoholic beverages of the type specified in the order calling said election in accordance with the terms of the Texas Liquor Control Act until such time as the qualified voters of said area may thereafter, at a legal election held for that purpose by a majority vote decide otherwise. The Clerk of this Court shall, within three days from date of this order, certify the results of the above mentioned election to the Secretary of State at Austin, Texas.**

It is further found and determined that notice of the date, place, and subject of this meeting was posted on the bulletin board located at a place convenient to the public in the County Courthouse, Hemphill, Texas, at least 72 hours preceding the day of this meeting and that all of the terms and provisions of Article 6252-17 have been complied with and a copy of said notice together with the return of posting shall be attached to this order and become a part thereof.

The above order being read, it was moved and seconded that same do pass. Thereupon, the question being called for, the following members of the Court voted AYE: R. E. Smith, G. W. Russell, Jr., Paul Lout, Jimmy Vickers, and the following members voted NO: _____
