Motion by Commissioner G. W. Russell Jr. seconded by Commissioner Eldridge Ellison to enter letter from Sheriff Blain Greer in Commissioner's Court minutes. Motion carried. Marked Exhibit "A" and attached to minutes of this date.

Motion by Commissioner G. W. Russell Jr. seconded by Commissioner R. E. Smith and with all voting "Aye" the Quarterly Report was approved. Marked Exhibit "B" and attached to minutes of this date. Mr. John Strain from Blue Cross Blue Shield came and explained our coverage which does not include Psychiatric care.

Motion by Commissioner R. E. Smith seconded by Commissioner G. W. Russell Jr. and with all voting in favor of the motion the following was passed. "This motion does not effect previous interpretation of the current Group Insurance policy with Blue Cross Blue Shield as of this date July 14th, 1980 for the continuing contract period. A copy which is marked Exhibit "C" and attached to the minutes of this date.

Motion by Commissioner R. E. Smith seconded by Commissioner  
Commissioner Eldridge Ellison to urge the Blue Cross Blue Shield  
Insurance Company to pay the claim in question due to the fact that  
the Court Minutes of June 25th, 1979 does not reflect the Phychiatric  
Care being dropped and the booklets mailed to the Clerk were incorrect.

Gary Adams and Ernest Grossman of Temple Industries Inc.  
met with the court concerning the jail to be constructed, or add  
on to existing facility and also parking space. Motion by Commissioner  
G. W. Russell Jr. seconded by Commissioner Eldridge Ellison to  
hire this company to look into the matters at hand make a study  
and report back. The amount agreed on was approximately \$3,000.  
All voted in favor of this motion.

Motion by Commissioner G. W. Russell Jr. seconded by  
Commissioner Eldridge Ellison to keep the tax rate at 80¢ per  
\$100.00 valuation. Motion carried.

Motion by Commissioner R. E. Smith seconded by Commissioner  
G. W. Russell Jr. to divide the Revenue Sharing money in the  
amount of \$15,456.77 equally between the Commissioner Precincts  
and Administrative Fund.

Also the interest from the Certificate of Deposit on the  
Officers Salary Fund Certificate to be divided equally between the  
four Commissioners Precincts. Motion carried.

Motion by Commissioner R. E. Smith seconded by Commissioner  
Eldridge Ellison to divide the R & B Special in the amount of  
\$5,524.72 and the R & B Tax in the amount of \$494.62 by percentage  
as follows:

#1 22%  
#2 27%

#3 20%  
#4 31%



Motion by Commissioner G. W. Russell Jr. seconded by Commissioner R. E. Smith and with all voting "Aye" the Court approved the permit with G-M Water Supply Corporation and set the bond at \$10,000.00 Marked Exhibit "D" and attached to minutes of this date. The Clerk was also directed to write a letter directing that the Commissioner of the various precincts be notified before entering the particular subdivisions.

On November 12th, 1979 the Commissioners Court agreed to pay to MHMR \$2500.00 toward the Sheltered Workshop project when the work was started. By letter of request dated July 2, 1980 and upon a motion by Commissioner R. E. Smith seconded by Commissioner Eldridge Ellison and with all voting in favor the money was directed to be paid.

Letter from office of Revenue Sharing concerning allotment for Sabine County attached to the minutes of this date marked Exhibit "E".

Accounts were allowed and made payable.

There being no further business, the court adjourned.

COUNTY ROAD PERMIT AND APPROVAL

TO: G-M WATER SUPPLY CORPORATION


THE UNDERSIGNED Commissioners Court of Sabine County, Texas has no objection to the location of the proposed water lines of G-M WATER SUPPLY CORPORATION on Sabine County right-of-way, in connection with its Rosevine and Pine Park Extension construction, as shown by accompanying drawings and maps presented this date. Said water lines shall be owned by a non-profit organization.

A permit is hereby granted for continuous use of the afore-said county right-of-way by the said G-M WATER SUPPLY CORPORATION, but it is expressly understood that the Sabine County Commissioners Court does not purport hereby to grant any right, claim, title or easement in or upon such right-of-way.


Any and all work and construction on county right-of-way shall be performed in accordance with county instructions, and it is specifically provided that such work shall be done in accordance with the specifications listed on Exhibit "A", attached hereto and incorporated herein by reference for all purposes. The installation of the water lines described herein shall not damage any portion of any county road, and adequate provisions must be made to cause minimum inconvenience to traffic and adjacent property owners. The Contractor of this project shall make a \$10,000.00 bond, payable to Sabine County, conditioned that the county roads will be left in the same condition as they were found.


Sabine County will at no time be held liable for any damage done to the aforesaid water lines through the improvement or maintenance of county roads. It is hereby agreed with the undersigned Commissioners Court that this County Road Permit and Approval can be assigned to the Farmers Home Administration, an agency of the United States Government, for collateral for monies received to construct said water lines.



(OIL ROAD OR ASPHALT)

Cut straight across from bar ditch to bar ditch, no wider than absolutely necessary, with compacted foundation and surface mixture must be restored to its original state.

(Procedure for cutting native gravel road)

Road must be cut straight across from bar ditch to bar ditch, no wider than absolutely necessary to accommodate pipe. Before cutting, existing compacted gravel surface must be cut off and pushed back out of the way. After the cut and pipe is laid, the ditch is filled and compacted before returning the gravel to the surface. When leaving, the surface must have a minimum of 6" of compacted gravel on top of and at least 8 ft. either way from the cut. No exposed clay may be showing.

(ALL ROADS)

Cutting is preferred to boring unless otherwise stated by the Commissioner in that precinct. All bar ditches must be restored to an acceptable state that will handle the water and complement drainage. Anything that blocks, hinders, interrupts, or inhibits speedy, efficient drainage is absolutely forbidden. The contractor is required to see that all provisions are adhered to 100%. He will also be held responsible for damages to property, both public and private. He is also responsible for any overtime labor or expense incurred by the county due to neglect on his part. He is also responsible for damages to culverts, cattle guards, bridges or any other county materials or equipment damaged by his equipment or personnel in his hire.

upon completion of his job, he may be released from responsibility only by agreement of the Commissioners Court that all specifications and conditions have been satisfied. All points of these specifications are negotiable with the Commissioner in the precinct in which the work is occurring.

DEAR CHIEF EXECUTIVE OFFICER:

AS I AM SURE YOU KNOW, THE REVENUE SHARING PROGRAM WILL EXPIRE AT THE END OF THE CURRENT ENTITLEMENT PERIOD (EP 11).

WHILE NO PAYMENTS AFTER OCTOBER 1980 ARE CURRENTLY AUTHORIZED, THE ADMINISTRATION HAS BEFORE THE CONGRESS A PROPOSAL FOR A FIVE-YEAR REAUTHORIZATION OF PAYMENTS TO LOCAL GOVERNMENTS. THE PROPOSAL INCLUDES A NUMBER OF MODIFICATIONS IN THE ALLOCATION FORMULA THAT MAY CHANGE THE AMOUNT OF YOUR GOVERNMENT'S PAYMENT. FIRM INFORMATION WILL NOT BE AVAILABLE UNTIL THE CONGRESS COMPLETES ACTION ON THE RENEWAL LEGISLATION. HOWEVER, ESTIMATES OF THE ALLOCATIONS FOR YOUR GOVERNMENT UNDER THE ADMINISTRATION'S PROPOSAL ARE AVAILABLE ON REQUEST FROM THE ORS INTERGOVERNMENTAL RELATIONS DIVISION.

FINAL AMOUNTS HAVE BEEN COMPUTED FOR EP 11 USING FINAL DATA. YOUR GOVERNMENT'S FINAL PERIOD 11 ENTITLEMENT IS \$3,162 LESS THAN THE AMOUNT ESTIMATED FOR THIS EP.

TO AVOID CREATING AN OVERPAYMENT, WE HAVE DEDUCTED \$3,162 FROM YOUR GOVERNMENT'S OCTOBER 4 PAYMENT (OCTOBER 1980) FOR PERIOD 11.

A REVISED 1975 PER CAPITA INCOME ESTIMATE OF \$3,171, AS REPORTED BY THE CENSUS BUREAU, WAS USED IN THE FINAL ALLOCATION PROCESS FOR EP 11. OTHER DATA FACTORS REMAIN UNCHANGED, UNLESS YOU HAVE BEEN PREVIOUSLY NOTIFIED.

YOU WILL BE ADVISED OF ANY CHANGE IN YOUR ACCOUNT STATUS. IF YOU HAVE ANY QUESTIONS OR NEED MORE INFORMATION, CONTACT THE ORS SYSTEMS AND OPERATIONS DIVISION. BE SURE TO INCLUDE YOUR ORS ACCOUNT NUMBER, 44 1 202 202, AND YOUR STATUS CODE, 052, IN ANY CORRESPONDENCE CONCERNING THIS LETTER.
