Motion by Commissioner R. E. Smith, seconded by Commissioner G. W. Russell, Jr. and with all voting "Aye" Royce C. Smith, County Judge was appointed to serve on the Board of Directors of the Deep East Texas Council of Governments. See Certification marked Exhibit "A" and attached to the minutes of this date.

After a discussion with the Forest Ranger, Mr. Hawkins, Motion was made by Commissioner G. W. Russell, Jr., seconded by Commissioner Eldridge Ellison and with all voting in favor an Amendment was agreed upon which is marked "Exhibit B" and attached to the minutes of this date.

Mr. R. V. Hyden appeared before the court concerning a right of way through government land. The road would lead to the Hyden Cemetery. Mr. Hawkins and Commissioner Russell agreed to meet and go down to the place to see what could be worked out.

Perry Simpson, Representative of MHMR for Sabine, Shelby and San Augustine Counties appeared before the court concerning the continuing of the MHMR program. Motion by Commissioner G. W. Russell, Jr. and seconded by Commissioner R. E. Smith a Resolution was adopted to continue with this program. Commissioner R. E. Smith brought it to the attention of the court that they had only agreed to help on the Sheltered Workshop for one year to see how it came out. The Resolution agreed upon it attached to the minutes of this date and marked "Exhibit C".

Dewitt Vickers appeared before the court concerning clearing out and widening of the road passing his house. He wanted it made into a Second Class Road with 30 ft. right of way. Commissioners Vickers said he would check with James Allen Payne, County Attorney on the matter.

Motion by Commissioner Jimmy Vickers, seconded by Commissioner Eldridge Ellison to keep salaries of the Deputy Sheriffs the same after the Corp of Engineers money was gone. After discussion the matter was tabled until next meeting day.

There being no further business, the court adjourned.

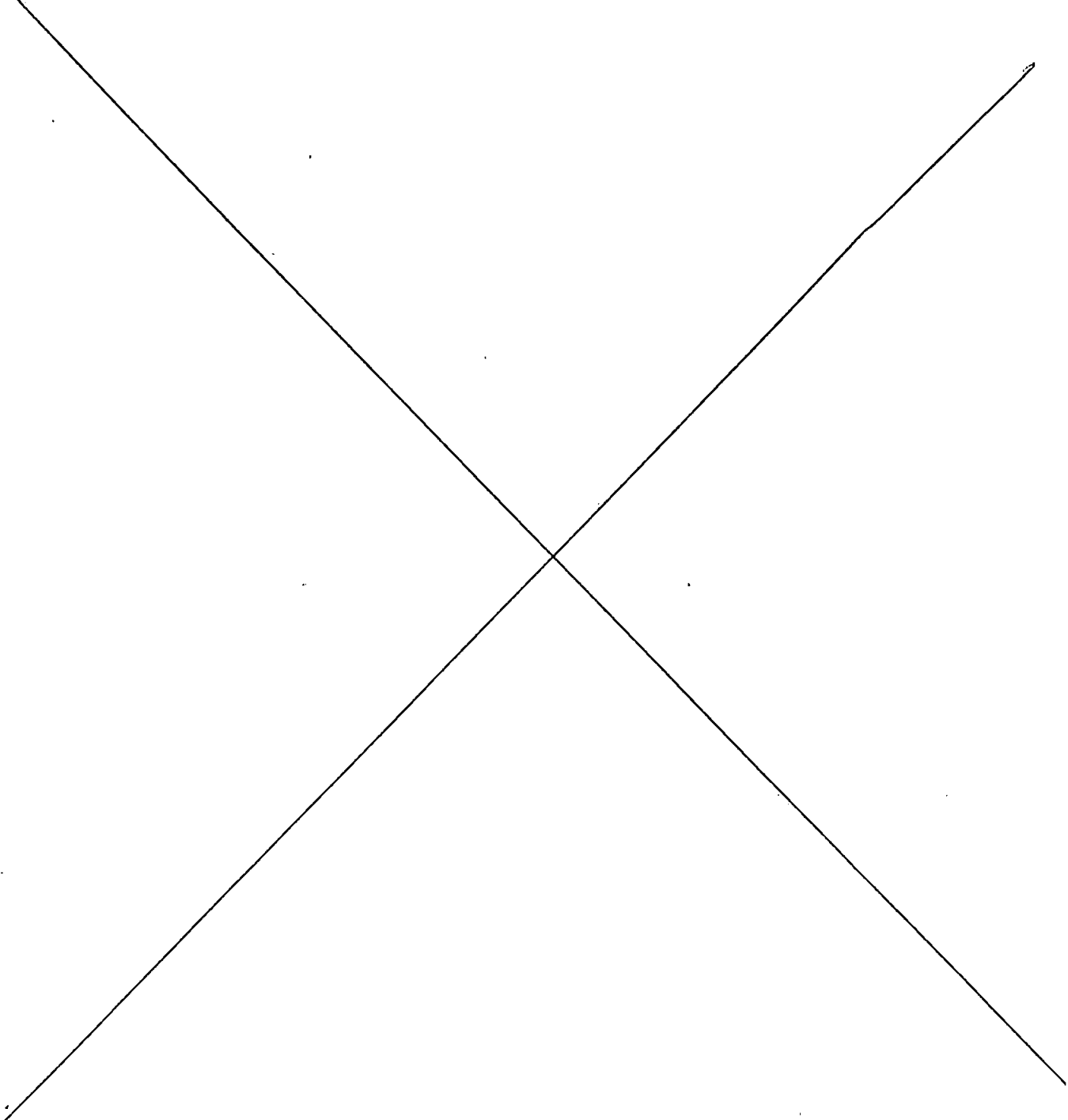

The parties hereto have mutually agreed to amend this agreement as follows:

Preamble, second paragraph:

Delete 23 USC 205 and insert 16 USC 532, 535.


Preamble, third paragraph:

Delete text beginning with --- "Forest Development ---" on the second line through the word --- dependent" on the seventh line and insert --- "Forest Development roads within and near the National Forests and other lands administered by the Forest Service in locations and according to specifications which will permit maximum economy in harvesting timber from lands tributary to such roads and at the same time meet the requirements for protection, development, and management thereof, and for utilization of the other resources thereof."

All other provisions of the agreement referred to remain as stated.



RESOLUTION

WHEREAS, the Sabine County Commissioners' Court wholeheartedly supports the concept of locally governed community mental health and mental retardation services and works closely with the Deep East Texas MHRM Center,

AND WHEREAS, the Deep East Texas MHRM Center provides an important array of services for the mentally disabled citizens of Sabine County,

AND WHEREAS, the needs for services for the mentally disabled citizens of Sabine County exceed our Center's current capacity to clinically respond,

BE IT RESOLVED, that the Sabine County Commissioners' Court perceives the need for a significant increase in state grant-in-aid funding for all community MHRM centers in fiscal years 1982 and 1983, to provide for adequate services at the community level and develop a balanced MHRM delivery system across the State,
